

\$200,000 RAISED BY REDS FOR BAIL OF N. Y. SUSPECTS

Senator Lusk Warns People Not to Be Lulled Into Sense of Security by Recent Campaign.

New York, Jan. 7.—(U. P.)—Fourteen men and one woman were arrested by department of justice men at a meeting of the Communist Labor party in the offices of the Russian newspaper Novy Mir, East Tenth street. A long list of subscribers to the "battle fund" of the Communist party was taken in the raid.

A bail fund of \$200,000 has been raised for the radical suspects arrested in the latest raids, it was announced tonight by Elizabeth Gurley Flynn, well known radical agitator.

At headquarters of the department of justice in this city it was stated tonight that 63 prisoners had been taken in the 24 hours ending at 7 o'clock tonight.

HEARS FROM RADICAL
A radiogram from Emma Goldman on board the "Soviet Ark" Buford, which was received today by Miss Goldman's niece, Mrs. Stella Ballentine, reported all well on board the transport.

It came by way of Land's End, England.

"We have in the state alone over 20,000 alien enemies openly organized for the overthrow of our government by force and violence acting under direction of the Bolsheviks," said in Moscow, said State Senator Clayton R. Lusk, chairman of the executive committee to investigate radicalism, in a statement issued today.

Senator Lusk warns the people of the state not to be lulled into a feeling of false security because of the recent wholesale arrests.

"In these raids we have barely scratched the surface," he tells of the discovery by the legislative investigators that in Rochester Socialist Sunday schools have been used as a medium for the distribution of propaganda.

CHARGED WITH CONTEMPT
At these meetings, he adds, a resolution was adopted for the circulation of 10,000 copies of Lenin's "Letter to the American Workingmen."

An order was issued today for the arrest of Dr. Michael Mielig, former treasurer of the Russian federation, for contempt of court in refusing to answer questions before the Lusk committee with reference to certain radical activities.

Dr. Mielig, it was announced, will be confined to Ludlow street jail until he agrees to answer the questions of the committee.

While the Lusk committee men and other state officials were resuming their efforts to uncover and curb plots of the radicals against the state and federal government, agents of the department of justice and officials of the bureau of immigration were rushing the work of disposing of the hearings of the aliens sought in the latest roundup of radicals.

SENT FROM WEST
There are now 522 alleged "Reds" in custody on Ellis island, 32 of these being women. More are expected from the West in the next few days.

The colony on the island was increased today by the arrival of 10 more, these women from Trenton, N. J., most of them former employees of the Roebing wire plant. All seemed prosperous and were well supplied with funds.

One of the names of J. W. W. secretaries in Portland, Umatilla, Astoria, Yakima, Pasco, Spokane and numerous Northwestern cities were found.

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States Bryan Will Be Candidate at Nebraska Primary
Omaha, Neb., Jan. 7.—(U. P.)—William J. Bryan's name will be on the Democratic primary ticket as a candidate for president at the primaries next spring, according to Louis F. Langhorst, former chairman of the Democratic state central committee.

Langhorst is here to complete arrangements for the reception of Bryan, who speaks here January 12. Four hundred Bryan boosters from the state will be present, Langhorst said.

WOMEN REDS ARE ANGERED BY CAMERAS

New York, Jan. 7.—(U. P.)—An uproar that nearly developed into a riot broke out in the main detention room at Ellis island this afternoon, when a group of women prisoners, rounded up in the recent "Red" raid, attacked several motion picture photographers engaged in "filming" the prisoners. The women knocked the machines down and fought with guards who attempted to restrain them. It took the guards several minutes to restore order.

Gregory Weinstein, secretary to Ludwig Martens, self-styled soviet ambassador, gave five guards a hard tussle when his photograph was taken for the government records. He objected strenuously to being photographed, but with five guards holding him, he was finally photographed.

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COURT RULES BOSS MAY TRANSFER STAR TO 'SUPER' IN MOB

Temperament Bubbles Over When Actress Is Forced to Join the Ranks of Spear Toters.

Los Angeles, Jan. 7.—(U. P.)—There was wailing and gnashing of teeth in the Hollywood motion picture colony Tuesday. It was because the district court of appeals had shorn the film stars of their temperaments and, what's immeasurably worse, ruled that hard-hearted directors can take a star out of the dramatic firmament and cast her in the part of a mob.

The decision was made in the appeal by the New York Motion Picture company from a \$100 judgment entered against it in the lower court in favor of Lola May, movie star.

Miss May, the company held, was temperamental in that she would not show up until 11 o'clock when told to report at 8:30. The court ruled that under her contract Miss May had to show up when told, despite her temperament, and refused to see where the company had broken its part of the agreement, even though Miss May's allegation that she was cast in a "mob" part, instead of as a lead, were true.

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
