Linn County Agent's Expenses to Be Paid By Private Citizens

Albany, Jan. 8.—Members of the farm bureau of Linn county at a luncheon conference held in Albany Wednesday decided to finance the office of the county agricultural agent by private subscription, the request to the county court to include that office in the annual budget having been denied. This will make the third year that the farmers and business men of the county have contributed the proportion of the county agent's expense which is supposed to be borne by

taxation. After the meeting 22 men mutually pledged themselves to raise \$100 each, \$500 being subscribed before the meeting adjourned.

At the annual stockholders' and directors' meetings of the Albany State bank to be held Thursday, a successor will be elected for D. H. Bodine, who has been the bank's president for two years. Bodine, who was twice elected sheriff of Linn county, has disposed of his stock in the bank, his associates having bought his interests.

A jury in the municipal court held that the slot machine operated in the cigar store of Fred Fritz, Second and Burnside streets, was a gambling device, finding Fritz guilty after a prolonged trial Wednesday afternoon before Judge Rossmann. Because of the late hour, sentence was not passed, and the case will be concluded today. Nine other storekeepers have been arrested for operating similar machines.
