

OVERSEAS DRUM INTERESTING AS A MEMENTO OF WAR

Portland Musician Proud of Names of Many Interesting Personages on Drum Head.

Memories of pleasant, though sometimes exciting and exacting, days in France are not difficult to recall to the mind of Lynton E. Athey, 2913 Fifty-fourth street southeast, until recently a member of the forty-sixth company, twentieth engineers, overseas.

Athey brought back with him the bass drum, purchased in France, upon which he beat out his accompaniments as a member of the company band. The band was an unofficial organization within the company, but it was composed of talented musicians and rapidly assumed the proportions of an army institution, traveling extensively.

DRUM INTERESTING RELIC

The drum is Athey's notable relic from the war zone, for, during its musical career, its owner collected upon its two faces the signatures of notable members of audiences in France and Spain, including not only American and associated army officers, nurses and Red Cross girls, but the signatures of a large number of French and Spanish municipal and government officials.

On one face the drum bears a practically complete diary of the movements of the band, showing such notable functions as a review by General Pershing. The drum only missed bearing the autograph of President Wilson because Athey had left the instrument in his billet when he met the president at Paris.

The diary written on the taut skins indicates wide travel overseas and a very active musical career for the forty-sixth company band, showing that in the audiences to which it played were some highly important personages.

TAKES WILSON'S PICTURE

Athey met President and Mrs. Wilson face to face in Paris. They were promenading, apparently unaccompanied, when Athey spied the executive. Lingering his hand to a snappy salute as the president approached, Athey took a long chance.

"Gee, I'd like a picture," he exclaimed. "Certainly, help yourself," President Wilson said, smiling as he adjusted his position to pose. Athey's picture shows the president's smile and the appearance of interest he displayed in the amateur photographic effort.

At Hohkneberg castle, formerly used as a hunting lodge by the former German kaiser, Athey found some of the most interesting things on his tour over Alsace. Just by way of securing a memento the soldier relieved the bathroom door of its huge key and that unwieldy instrument now adds about a pound of weight to his baggage.

Horse Too Expensive For Orchard Work; Tractor Now Used

Hood River, Jan. 10.—That the horse for work on orchard tracts is rapidly passing is evidenced by the remarkable number of tractors which have been purchased here during the past two months. With hay at \$35 per ton, and other feeds proportionately high, the orchardist who gets down to costs has come to recognize that the horse is about the dearest form of traction today.

A number of mysterious deaths among equines during the past two months, which have been attributed to flu and anthrax, are believed due to arsenate of lead sprays on clover and alfalfa in the orchards.

The orchardist recognizes that it is far more economical to haul his heavy power sprayers on the side hills by tractors than by horses, and the problem of hauling the fruit to the apple house during bad weather is one that is more easily overcome by the tractor.

The passing of the horse was more apparent after the heavy snow storm three weeks ago than ever before in years, because the farmer who still owned a team was much in demand to haul sleds over the frozen snow.

Dr. V. R. Abraham, recently returned from army service overseas, and prominent in Legion circles locally, has been appointed county physician, in addition to his post of county health officer.

Hood River Court Allots \$1500 for Lost Lake Road

Hood River, Jan. 10.—The county court has decided to allot from the road fund an appropriation of \$1500 for continuation of the county section of the Lost lake road. This sum, with the money already in hand, will be sufficient to provide for a good dirt auto road to the forest boundary from which point the forestry department will resume work on the four and one half mile section to the lake as soon as the snow is off the ground. It is expected that the road through to the lake will be passable early in the summer.

Woman Resident Of Seaside Is Dead

Seaside, Jan. 10.—Mrs. Johanna Spencer, long a resident of this city, died Thursday evening at the age of 66 years. She had resided in Seaside for 26 years. She is survived by Mrs. Dell Thorogood, a daughter, of Seaside, and a grand daughter, Lena Spencer.

DEALER IN POISONOUS FOOD GETS OFF WITH FINE OF \$25 IN COURT

Canned Salmon Unfit for Human Consumption Was Sold, Says Commissioner Mickle.

That the circuit court has been as lenient toward offenders against public safety in the purveying of food as the Sorensons of automobile accident notoriety, was asserted today by J. D. Mickle, state dairy and food commissioner.

A fine of \$500 and a jail sentence of 30 days imposed by Judge Bell of the district court was reduced merely to a \$25 fine in the circuit court, declared the dairy and food commissioner, who added: "Last May a complaint was made to the office of the dairy and food commissioner that a certain lot of canned salmon had been sold to a grocery firm in Portland, which salmon was spoiled and unfit for human food. Upon investigation we found the complaint to be justified. Accordingly William Reed was arrested for violating the food laws in the state of Oregon."

"On August 15, Reed was tried and convicted before a jury in the district court. Judge Bell presiding, and sentenced to pay a fine of \$599; also to serve 30 days in jail."

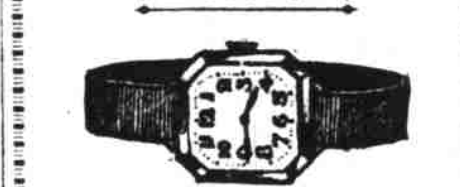
"In passing sentence, Judge Bell made the remark, 'I can hardly believe that you realize the heinousness of your crime. Anyone who would knowingly sell for human food such poisonous stuff as the evidence shows that you disposed of in this instance, deserves the heaviest possible penalty. Your act was little less than murder. This might have been eaten by children or grown people, and so is almost equivalent to murder.'"

"A disinterested chemist present at the trial stated to the court and jury that he would not eat a mouthful of this salmon for \$1000."

"An appeal was taken to the circuit court, which came up for hearing December 6, but apparently disregarding the nature of the offense, the finding of the jury and the sentence of the lower court, Reed was let off with a fine of \$25."

COUNTY COURT'S FEE INCREASES SET NEW MARK

Gain Comes Chiefly From Circuit Court; Total Increase \$23,594 Over Previous 12 Months.

An increase of the total county court fees for 1919 of \$23,594 over the previous year, the greatest increase ever recorded in Multnomah county, is shown in the comparative statement recently compiled by J. N. Willoughby, deputy county clerk.

The greatest increase comes in circuit court fees, where \$35,209.80 was taken in for 1919, as compared with \$29,999.05 for 1918. An increase of approximately \$2000 in probate court fees and \$1000 in circuit court library fees is shown in the record.

A greatly lessened interest in hunting and fishing was displayed in Multnomah county in 1919 if the county records can be taken as a basis for reckoning.

HUNTING LICENSES DECREASE

A decrease is recorded not only in the hunters' licenses and anglers' licenses, but also in the combination licenses, which heretofore were very popular.

A new feature on the statement is the \$419 collected for state dog licenses. This is being collected in conformance with an act passed at the last legislature. Recently the issuance of licenses was suspended pending an opinion from the district attorney's office as to the validity of the law.

A total of \$4638.60 was collected from litigants throughout the year to be turned over to the circuit court library. This library is run solely for the benefit of lawyers, no one but lawyers being allowed to use the library.

One item which shows an increase of 25 cents over 1918, but which will disappear from statements in the future, is the prohibition license fee. A fee of 25 cents has heretofore been collected on all licensees issued, which entitle a church representative to purchase wines for sacramental purposes.

The fees collected from these licensees totaled \$538.75 in 1917, 50 cents in 1918 and 75 cents in 1919.
