

MOTHER BELIEVES ARMY OFFICER AND HER BOY ARE ON THEIR WAY EAST

Nothing Heard From Lieut. Alexander Jones Since He Went Away With Child.

Six-year-old Bernard Jones is on his way to an Eastern army camp with his father, Lieutenant Alexander Jones, believes the child's mother and the wife of the army officer.

Lieutenant Jones on Wednesday was given custody of his child for a few hours following a conference with Mrs. Jones' attorney, and he failed to return. Inquiry, she says, developed the fact that the lieutenant checked out from his hotel Wednesday morning and that since he has not been seen.

"You'll never see Paddy any more," the lieutenant is alleged to have telephoned Mrs. Jones after he took the child with him from the conference with the lawyer. Mrs. Jones will appeal to District Attorney Evans for help. "We were talking to my lawyer, A. M. Crawford," Mrs. Jones declares. "My husband asked to take the boy for a few hours, and Crawford advised me to allow this. Jones was to bring Paddy back before evening."

Her husband was cruel and wrote sneering letters to her while he was in France, far behind the firing lines. Jones secured an annulment of his

wife's divorce, granted by Judge Gattens while he was in France. The soldiers' relief act prohibits court action against a man in war service.

The running off of the films will precede the state conference of the Armenian relief campaign forces to be held in the Hotel Benson at noon Monday, when the preliminary educational campaign will be launched by the inspirational address of General Mesrop Agapetian, Armenian diplomat, statesman and military leader, who will be here Sunday and Monday.

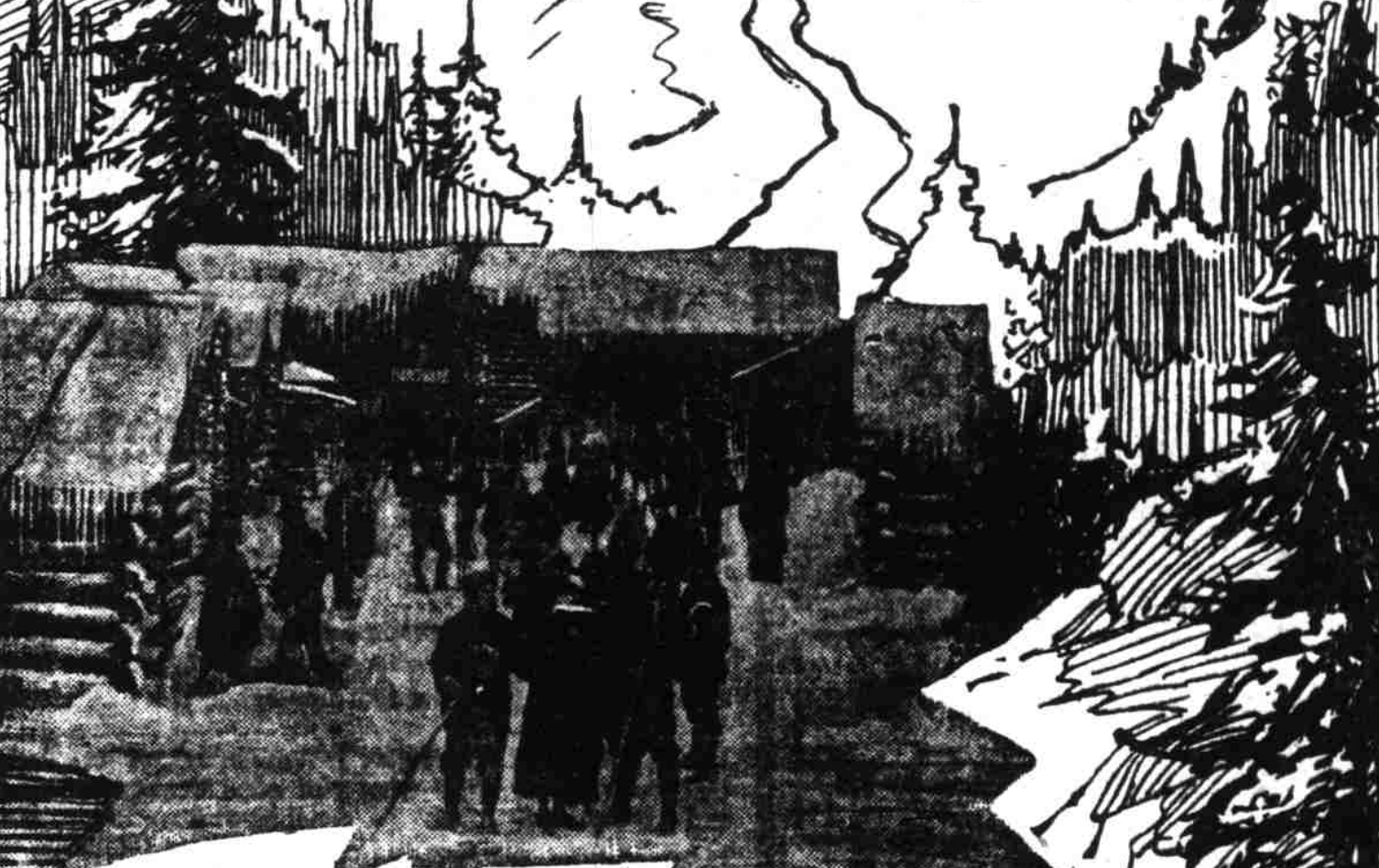
