

GREATEST HONORS OF WAR WON BY 36 OREGON BOYS

Of Total Number in State, 15
Portland Soldiers Wear the
Distinguished Service Cross.

Thirty-six Oregon soldiers who saw wartime service overseas wear the distinguished service cross as a result, according to a compilation just issued, showing that less than one per cent of the Americans who fought won either the congressional medal of honor or the distinguished service cross.

Portland leads among Oregon cities, with 15 sons who won the cross, although the total reaches 18 when the Linton and North Portland medal winners are included, as they should be, as in Portland proper. Three Salem boys were similarly decorated.

OREGON COMPARES FAVORABLY Oregon ranks comparatively well with other states in the total number of awards, although states of greater population show considerably more of their sons with honor awards. New York leads, with 512 cross winners; while Wyoming and Nevada, with four each, are at the bottom of the list. Fifty-seven Washington men were decorated, as compared with 135 for California, 28 for Montana and 22 for Idaho. One Washington man won the congressional medal of honor.

To American soldiers 4920 distinguished service crosses were distributed while only 75 medals of honor were awarded. Nine of the latter went to New York men and seven to Indiana troops. Six were awarded to Californians.

AWARDS OF CROSSES The following, published with a general review of honor awards to American soldiers by the Fessett Publishing company of Washington, D. C., in "Heroes Ali," shows the awards of distinguished service crosses to Oregon men, according to the city from which they entered the service:
