

### ASTORIANS INDIGNANT BECAUSE TONGUE POINT BOND MEASURE VETOED

#### Senator Norblad and Port Commissioner Disapprove Olcott's Action; Plans to Go On.

Astoria, Jan. 23.—The news that Governor Olcott had vetoed the bill giving the Port of Astoria authority to sell bonds to the extent of 15 per cent of the total assessable property within the district for the purpose of raising money to purchase the Tongue Point site for a naval base to be given to the government, was received with surprise and chagrin by the people of Astoria.

Senator Norblad who put the bill through the senate said Thursday afternoon: "It is a great blow to Astoria and Oregon. I cannot agree with the governor for vetoing the measure. The least he might have done was to consult the author of the bill and find out if an emergency really does exist. He did not do so. The emergency clause was attached to the bill because an emergency does exist. Other Oregon ports were consulted and their representatives agreed that the bill was all right."
