

JENKINS GUILTY, INSISTS MEXICAN

Prosecuting Attorney Quoted as
Saying American Consul in
Collusion With Bandits.

Mexico City, Jan. 28.—(U. P.)—
William O. Jenkins, American consul
agent at Puebla, has been
proved guilty of collusion with band-
its who kidnaped him, the news-
paper El Democrata today quoted
Julio Mitchell, prosecuting attorney
in the Jenkins case, as asserting.
The newspaper quoted Mitchell as
saying it had been learned Jenkins was
arranging to sell his property, prepara-
tory to leaving for the United States.

Influenza Patients At The Dalles to Be Under Quarantine

The Dalles, Jan. 28.—All cases of in-
fluenza and grip will be quarantined and
isolated. The order is effective at once
and 500 placards have been ordered.

ever, it is not expected that he will
return to Portland for several months,
or in time for him to enter the sena-
torial contest, should he desire to do
so. It is understood that Senator Orton
intends to engage in the insurance busi-
ness in Detroit.

Accused Bootlegger Arrested at Eugene Sold Colored Water

Eugene, Jan. 28.—Dorsey Griffin, a
bootlegger from the Wendling camps, at-
tempted a little "boozie" business and
as a result is in the Lane county jail.
Before coming to town, it is alleged, he

came to Eugene and met two men in
soldier's uniform. They looked like
prospective customers, but it happened
they were secret service men.

nothing more than an evil smelling
water with little alcohol. They were
asked \$10 for the quart.

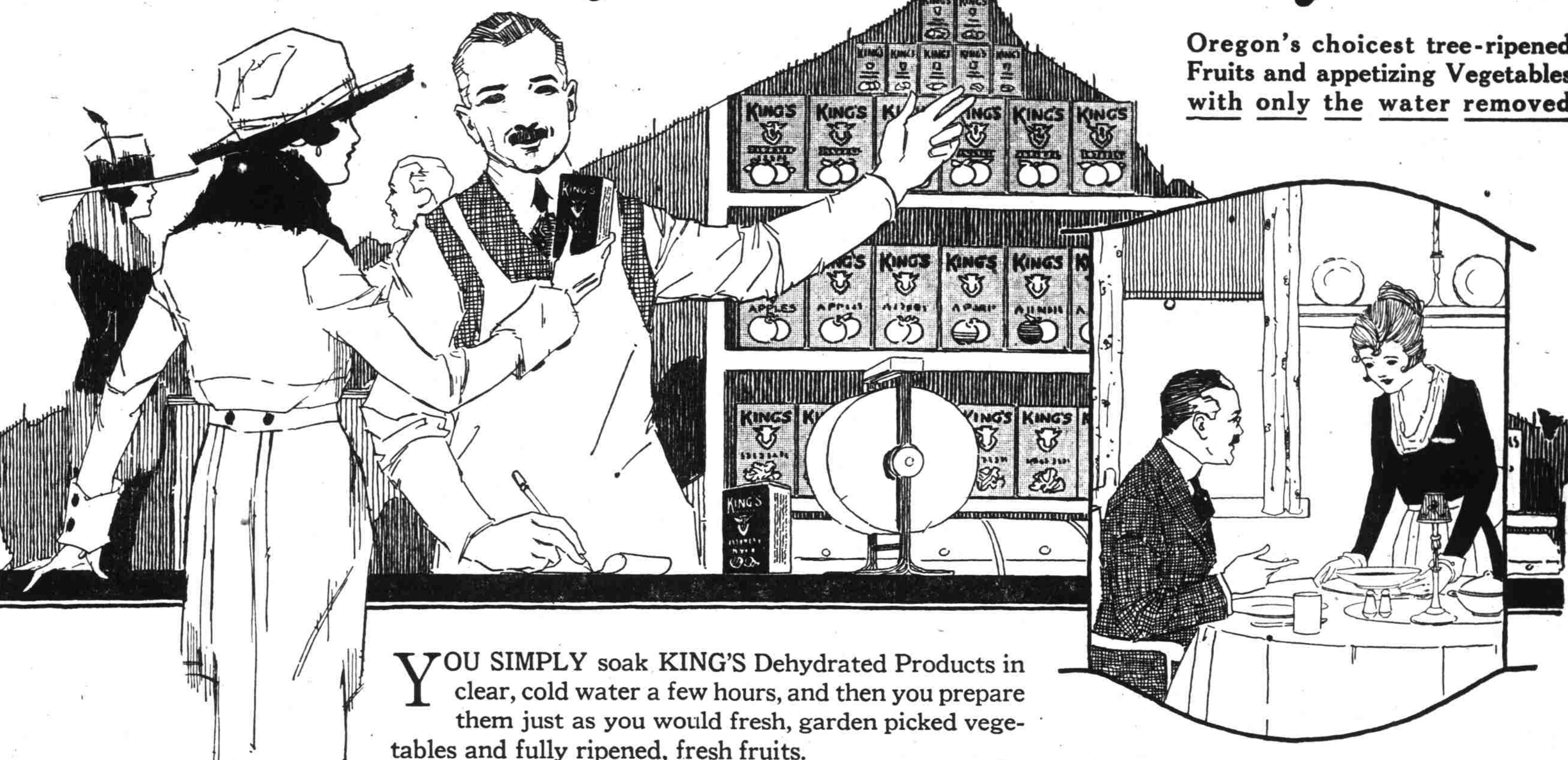
