

HOME FOR GIRLS TO BE BOUGHT BY SALVATION ARMY

\$80,000 to Be Paid for Refuge
Built and Maintained Under
Will of Late Henry E. Wemme

Negotiations are under way for the transfer of the White Shield home for unfortunate girls from the Christian Science church to the Salvation Army for a consideration of approximately \$80,000. The property consists of a little over five acres lying just below Willamette Heights on Alexander avenue and Mayfair street. The building is of fireproof construction, two stories in height and contains 40 rooms for the use of guests, besides offices, bath rooms and closets.

White Shield was built in accordance with the terms of the will of the late E. Henry Wemme, who died in December, 1915. Under the will, income producing property, with an appraised value of \$455,000, was set aside for the support of a maternity hospital and temporary home.

H. A. Wells, J. J. Cole and Jesse M. Carson were named as trustees of the property and incorporated the fund as a charitable organization. The building was finished in 1916 and was operated by the trustees until 1919, when, in accordance with the terms of the Wemme will, both the hospital and the supporting fund were turned over to a board of trustees representing six Christian Science churches of Portland.

The hospital was closed in July, 1919, and has not since been in operation. H. D. Kilham, secretary of the Christian Science board of trustees, admitted today that negotiations are under way looking to the transfer of the hospital building and grounds to the Salvation Army. The transaction probably will be closed Thursday, he said.

It is understood that the income producing property set aside for the support of the home by the Wemme will is to remain in the possession of the church. The transaction is being handled through the F. E. Taylor company.

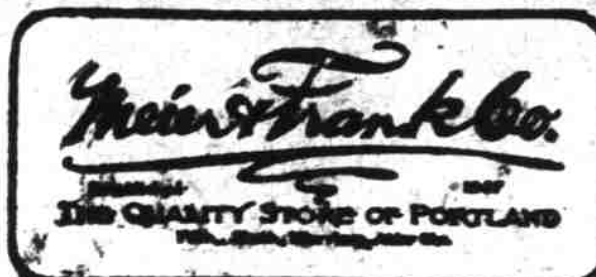
