

SOCIALISTS HAD PLAN TO AVOID LEGAL HINDRANCE

Evidence Before New York Judiciary Shows Care Had Been Taken to Keep Work Going.

Albany, N. Y., Jan. 30.—(I. N. S.)—William F. Crews sent instructions to members of the Young Peoples' Socialist League, of which he was secretary, how to avoid disruption by the authorities during the war, according to evidence introduced at the Socialist trial before the New York assembly. Among the instructions were: "Take several copies of each document and record and hide them away in safes and out of the way places."

Stockholders Want Receiver Named for Bank at Harrisburg

Albany, Or., Jan. 30.—J. R. Cartwright and G. A. McCarty, minority stockholders of the Farmers & Merchants bank at Harrisburg, have brought suit against George J. Wilhelm, Robert K. Burton and Cecil O. Wilhelm, officials of the bank, asking that a receiver be appointed, the affairs of the bank wound up and the assets distributed. It is claimed that the majority stockholders, who are also heavy stockholders of the First National bank, are operating the bank at a loss in order to prevent another bank from obtaining a charter.

The Linn county chapter of the American Red Cross has employed Miss Charlotte Walker, a trained nurse, who will serve the county under the auspices of the Red Cross. Miss Walker was a social service worker in New York city and was overseas during the war.

Franklin High Park Proposal to Be Put Up to City Council

Franklin High School Community club members propose to convince the park board and the city commission that a portion of the public park funds should be spent in purchase of a 10 acre wooded tract adjoining the high school campus on the west.

Mrs. George G. Root, president of the Franklin Parent-Teacher association, presided last night at a community meeting in the high school, and Mrs. L. E. Burdick was named chairman of a committee to present the matter at the regular meeting of the city council next Wednesday.

E. C. Gilmer, S. F. Ball and Mr. Burdick stressed the importance of prompt action on the playground project, pointing out that the site is most conveniently located for thousands of residents in the southeastern part of the city.

ALLOTMENTS MADE FOR FIRE PROTECTION IN NATIONAL LANDS

Completion of Telephone Lines First Feature of Work of Next Year.

Assistant District Forester A. O. Waha, Forest Examiner William B. Osborne Jr. and Forest Examiner M. L. Merritt returned this morning from a trip to the Santiam, Siskiyou, Stenslaw, Cascade, Umpqua and Crater national forests, where they have been making allotments for fire protection work for the coming season. "We are going to try to concentrate on completing our telephone line construction necessary to fire protective work," said Merritt, "and the rest of the money is to be devoted principally to camp ground improvement work and to provide better housing accommodations for our employees."
