

Able Teachers Are Secured for U. of O. Summer School Term

University of Oregon, Eugene, February 19.—Dr. H. D. Sheldon, dean of the summer school, states that especially able men and women have been secured for the summer school this year.

One of the best known is P. W. Horn, superintendent of city schools at Houston, Texas, who will give a course in problems of school supervision and a course on recent movements in the elementary course of study.

Professor Lincoln R. Gibbs, head of the English department in University of Pittsburgh, has been secured for the English literature department. Professor Gibbs, a graduate of Western University, who has done graduate work at Harvard, will give two courses, one on the novel in the 19th century and one on romantic poetry. The work in English composition will be given by Professor W. F. G. Thacher of the rhetoric department.

Pendleton Couple to Sail for Orient on Three Month Tour

Pendleton, Feb. 18.—Spanish War Veterans and their wives bade "bon voyage" Wednesday to George A. Hartman Jr., former commander of Malabon post No. 6, who leaves this evening with Mrs. Hartman on a three months' tour of the Orient. Hartman, cashier of a local bank, was a lieutenant in the Second Oregon regiment in 1898 and plans to revisit familiar scenes in the Philippines during the tour. They will sail from San Francisco February 28 and visit Honolulu, Japan, the Philippines, China and Korea.

Arthur Ridd, a senior in Pendleton high school, will be toastmaster at the "Father and Son" banquet to be held here Friday night. A big supper for 200 men and boys will be followed by short talks and a musical program. Several other towns in this county will observe the day.

Congregationalists In Fellowship Meet At the Pacific U.

Pacific University, Forest Grove, Feb. 18.—The Congregational ministers of Oregon have been holding a pre-Easter retreat or fellowship meeting for two days at Pacific university. Superintendent A. J. Sullivan arranged for the meeting and presided. Representative ministers from all parts of the state were present, to the number of 30. They were guests at luncheon and dinner of the "congregational church of Forest Grove and of President and Mrs. Clark of the university. On Wednesday morning the conference adjourned in a body to the college chapel, where Dr. W. T. McElveen spoke.

Cathlamet, Wash., Feb. 18.—The home of Mrs. Lillian Olmstead, about seven miles east of Cathlamet, was destroyed by fire, with all of its contents. The building was in flames when discovered. 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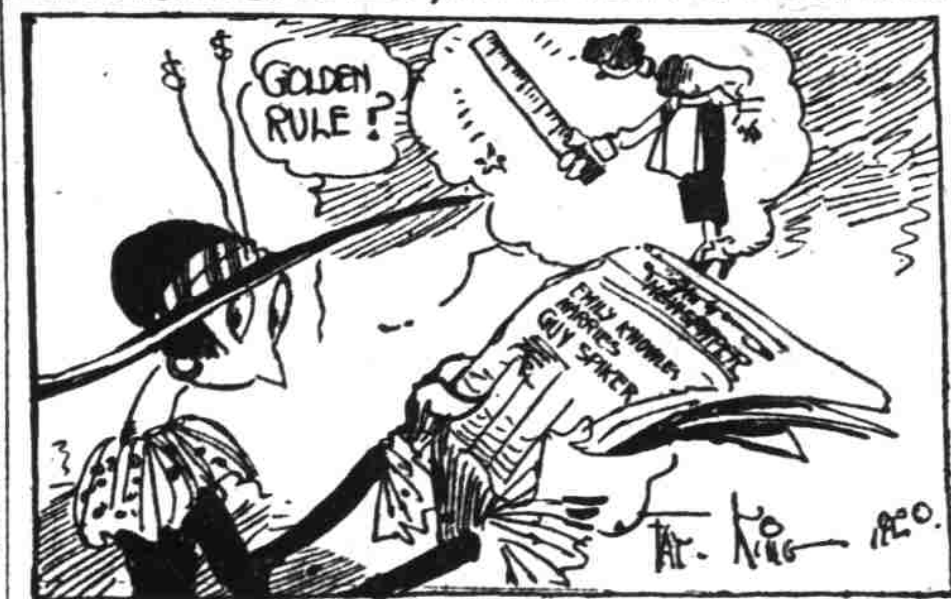


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MRS. SPIKER PUNISHED RIVAL ARTISTICALLY, FAY KING THINKS
