

PROSECUTION IN NEWBERRY CASE IS NEARLY DONE

Jury Has Stupendous Task in Weighing Testimony of 500 Witnesses and 150 Exhibits.

Grand Rapids, Mich., Feb. 21.—(U. P.)—The government has filed its heaviest guns at United States Senator Truman H. Newberry and his 122 co-defendants on trial here for election frauds in the senatorial campaign of 1918.

At the close of the fourth week of testimony taking today, Special Assistant Attorney General Duffey announced he would make every effort to close the prosecution's case within a week. The concluding days of the government's attack on the Michigan organization which is charged with conducting one of the most corrupt political campaigns in the country's history, is expected to be devoted to short range sniping at individual alleged offenders.

Counsel for the defense announced tonight that the defense will not require more than two weeks to present its case and that it should be in the hands of the jury by March 15.

This jury has a stupendous task on its hands. It must decide whether there was a conspiracy planned between Senator Newberry and his principal advisers to deliberately buy a seat in the senate.

It must decide whether the 122 defendants, who are on trial, participated in this alleged conspiracy.

It must examine 150 government exhibits, including nearly 1000 telegrams, to determine whether all these men acted in concert.

It must examine the testimony of approximately 500 witnesses to determine whether any defendants, if not all, are guilty of fraud or conspiracy.

It must decide what, if any, penalty is to be meted out if the men are found guilty.

Testimony presented by government witnesses today involve expenditure of small sums by several minor defendants.

PALMER STRONGEST OPPONENT Admittedly, Mitchell Palmer is the most powerful opponent of William Gibbs McAdoo. Both are strong Wilson followers, but among McAdoo men one hears serious doubts expressed as to the attorney general's ability, and of his unhappy contact with union labor in the coal strike.

In contrast they point out the record of the former director general of railroads who gave the railroad brotherhood a square deal, and even perhaps more sympathetic treatment in the matter of wages than they have received from the hands of anybody else in the Wilson administration.

CHIEF ACTS RECALLED

McAdoo, it is insisted, worked hard for woman suffrage, did a great deal for the soldiers by fathering the war risk insurance act, helped business by his part in the federal reserve act as well as in the smooth operation of the federal reserve system, did his part in moving crops when the farmers needed money, put the rural credits law in running order, did a lot toward urging a firm policy in handling Germany, and did his share in fighting the war.

The philosophy of the McAdoo group seems to be that the Democratic convention will choose a candidate who has the largest potential strength in the matter of vote getting. Thus is McAdoo trotted out as the friend of the suffragists, the farmer, the soldier, the union labor organizations, the business men and bankers of the country and the advocates of Americanism.

ADMINISTRATION INDORSED On one thing, however, the McAdoo candidacy will not be ambiguous. Others may say, as Bryan has admitted, that the general principle of the Wilson administration is approved. McAdoo will say without the slightest twinkle in his eye that he wholeheartedly approves of the Wilson administration.

POLICE WARN SCHOOL CHILDREN OF DANGERS LURKING IN STREETS

Lieutenant Ervin Gives Safety First Talks to All Schools in Portland.

Lieutenant Frank Ervin of the traffic bureau is carrying the campaign of accident prevention into Portland schools. Last week he went to the Montavilla, Rose City park and Falling schools with slides, showing the cause of accidents, lecturing thereon, and organizing safety organizations within the school.

"Never walk into the street from behind any object," he told the children at the Falling school Friday. "Never walk behind an automobile that may be parked near the curb, a woodpile, or anything that obstructs the view, until you look in both directions for an automobile that may take your life any instant."

"Never use a coaster wagon or push-mop on the streets. The streets were never constructed for you to play on. And don't carry an umbrella down over the face and eyes."

"Stealing rides on the back of automobiles and wagons is very dangerous. You may steal rides a great many times and you may once to often, and be struck by a automobile or motorcycle and killed or left crippled for the rest of your life."

Lieutenant Ervin organizes safety guards at each school, guards who are released from classes one minute early to keep the children from running into the street when classes are dismissed. He will go to every school in the city lecturing on accident prevention methods.

Oregon Shippers to Get Fair Allotment Wires Chamberlain

"Assurance has been given by the railroad administration that it is not their intention to deprive Oregon shippers of their fair allotment of railroad equipment available on the Pacific coast," says Senator George E. Chamberlain in answer to a query from the Chamber of Commerce as to whether the administration intended to carry out the order issued last week sending all empty cars of the Southern Pacific lines north of Ashland to the state of Washington to load.

"A serious shortage of cars has obtained for some time in the Puget Sound territory," continues the message, "and cars ordered from the S. P. are intended merely to equalize between all communities."

Despite the unfavorable report, local railroad officials still express confidence that the administration will not carry the order out in letter as a shortage of cars already affects this territory.

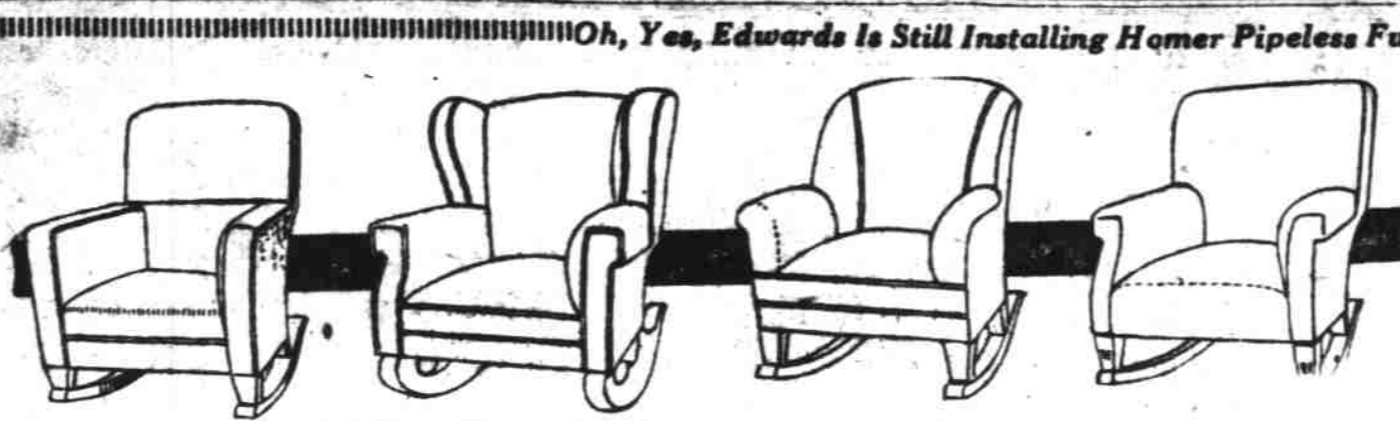

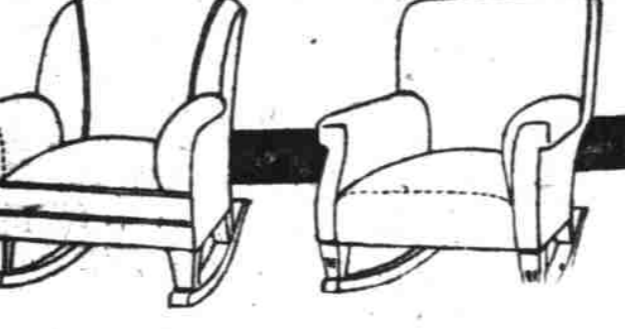

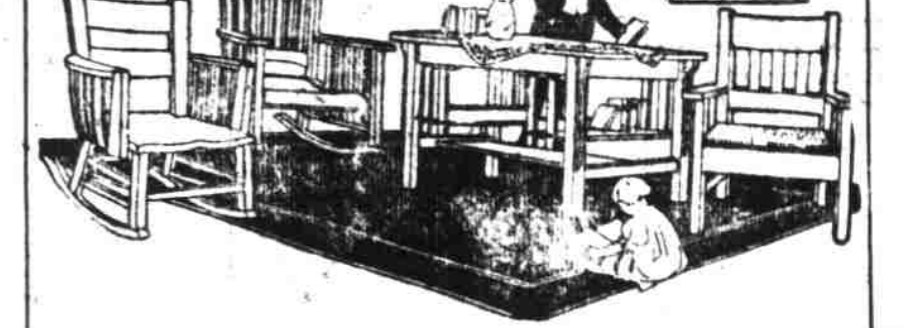
