

Salvation Army at Baker Organizes For Social Service

Baker, Feb. 24.—Under direction of George D. Beaumont, field representative of the Salvation Army, an advisory board to formulate plans for a social service organization in Baker was chosen from among public officials and business men and women of Baker. Thomas Montgomery, president of the Citizens National Bank, was elected president; Mrs. J. K. Romig, vice-president; Frank C. McCulloch, secretary; members of the board, Mayor W. W. Gardner, County Judge William Duh, Carl D. Silvan, Dr. J. W. Huff, James H. Nichols, J. P. O'Bryant, Dr. F. T. Nots, Harry Foreman and W. E. Meacham. The proposal of organizing a paid social service worker for Baker is being considered.

P. D. Wyatt, 55, a resident of Oregon for 55 years, died at Richland. He came with his parents in 1864 to the Grand Ronde valley. \$200,000 Hospital Planned for Salem

Salem, Feb. 24.—If the city of Salem will donate half of the money needed for the purchase of the necessary land and the erection of the building the Sisters of St. Vincent will erect a \$200,000 hospital building here, according to a letter received by Frederick Lamport. The building occupied by the Sisters of St. Vincent hospital at Roseburg was recently destroyed by fire and it is understood to be their desire to move the institution to Salem if sufficient financial encouragement can be obtained.
