The drive of the Congregational church in the United States to raise \$8,000,000 Pilgrim Memorial fund will begin Monday morning. The fund is thus named because it celebrates the three hundredth anniversary of the landing of the Pilgrims at Plymouth Rock. The fund now amounts to \$6,000,000, and when it is completed it will be \$8,000,000. The interest of this fund will guarantee all the ministers of the Congregational church who receive a salary of \$1000 a year or less, a pension of \$500 per annum after he becomes 65 years of age. 


