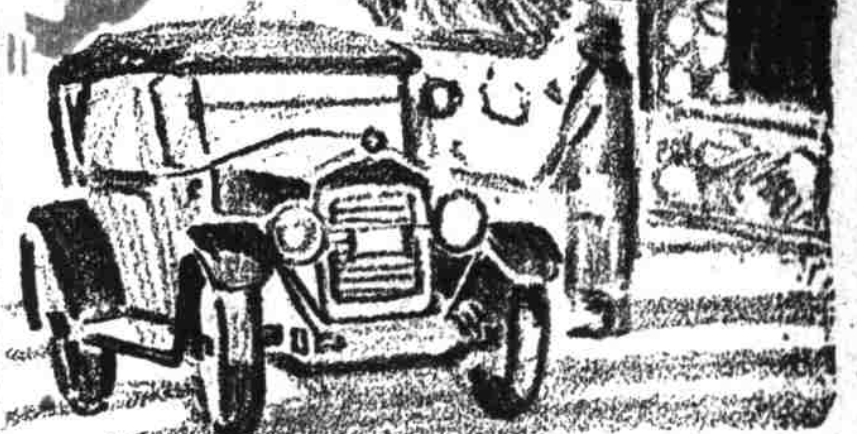
## SCOUTS FIND BAD 14-MILE STRETCH ON RAINIER TRIP

Incompleted Section of Lower Columbia River Highway Between  
Scappoose and Deer Island Is Difficult to Negotiate at Pres-  
ent Time; Road to Kalama via Vancouver Same Condition.

MOTORISTS bound for Seattle or those coming from the northern city to Oregon have been in a quandary to know whether the best route lay by way of Kalama and Vancouver, Wash., or by way of the ferry from Kalama through Goble and over the lower Columbia highway, the Linnton road and so on into the city. The road construction that has been going forward near Martin's Bluff, Wash., and more south of Toledo has made the route pretty much of a question, and most drivers have been going down to Goble, crossing the river there and taking a chance of what they would find between Kelso and Toledo.

Such a course was at one time the better one, and was so reported by most drivers who had attempted the trip, but the winter rains and snow, and then the long dry spell has resulted in the never very smooth route (Continued on Page Four, This Section)
