

TILLAMOOK FARMER REMEMBERS NOTHING OF FATAL ACCIDENT

Tillamook, March 11.—Charles Blum, a prosperous farmer of Tillamook county, held to the grand jury on a charge of manslaughter as a result of the death of Walter Smith last week, insists that he has no recollection of the occurrence which caused Smith's death. The facts appear to be that Blum and Smith started from the Blum place to attend a card party at James Langley's ranch, on the way they crossed the river and went to Smith's father's house in order that Smith might change his clothing. On the way back to the road Smith fell in the river and went back to his father's house for another change of clothing. The party, which now consisted of Blum, Roy Smith, a brother of the dead man, and two girls, went on in Blum's automobile. After going some distance Blum ran the automobile into the ditch and wrecked the top. He turned back toward his home and Roy Smith and the girls continued on foot. On reaching the Langley place they found the family had retired and there was no card party. They returned on foot. Towards morning Roy Smith started out to find his brother, who had not returned and whom he had last seen crossing the river, for the second time to change his clothes after falling in the river. He found the saddle horse, on which his brother had started after the rest of the party, badly crippled by the side of the road, between the Smith crossing and the place where Blum had turned back. At the Blum ranch he found the Blum automobile standing outside the garage, and inside the garage, covered with sacks and clothing, he found his brother's body. Blum says that all had been drinking hard cider before starting out and he has no recollection of anything after turning back for his home.
