

SENIORS WRESTLING WITH SOLUTION OF WORLD'S TROUBLES

Seniors majoring in economics at Reed college are writing graduation theses that will solve the high cost of living, stock and bond fluctuations, panics, profiteering, and many other of the world's ills. Economics seminar work under Professor Hudson Bridge Hastings is proving one of the most practical of Reed's senior research courses, seven students being engaged in investigating definite topics of industrial and financial interest.

Dorothy Poor, a senior of Burlingame, Cal., is writing on the effect of novelty advertising, window displays, luxurious restaurants, and other overhead expenses on the selling price of staple goods. Hazel Murray, whose ability in economics gave her the position of unit treasurer of all student funds at Reed, is delving into a similar subject from the groceryman's standpoint.

SEEN FINANCIAL CRISIS

Elbert Charman, who was circulation manager for Stars and Stripes overseas, in uncovering the causes of financial panics, and he speaks authoritatively of the "next one, which he predicts is fast approaching." Herbert Huff backs up the main talk with his thesis facts that deal with the value of money, and the rise and fall of Wall Street quotations. Frank Scott, also an overseas man, is preparing an expose of spruce production, with its enormous war profits. Arthur House of Hood River is accumulating facts for a thesis upon apple unions in Oregon.

Majorie Fulton of Alhambra, Cal., is entering a seminar discussion with queries as to the actual economic value of a college education, and the probable change of graduates' financial positions in their chosen fields. Miss Fulton is preparing questionnaires to be answered by Reed professors, former graduates and Portland business men and she will endeavor to prove that business training should accompany every course at Reed.

MAY PUBLISH RESULTS

The "econ majors" as they are called, meet once a week, and in animated discussion present the results of their research. With little help from their professor, they are seeking solutions to the problems that have puzzled people for centuries, and it is probable that some material contribution to the field of economics will result. According to Professor Hastings some of the theses may be published in the national journal of economics.

Summer Homesites Surveyed on Shores Of Mountain Lake

Twenty-two summer homesites have been surveyed on the shore of Elk lake at the summit of the Cascade mountain in the Deschutes national forest, accessible from Bend via Central Oregon, Assistant District Forester C. J. Buick announced this morning.

Elk lake is an unusually attractive mountain lake, being reached from Bend via Crane Prairie road to the highest high mountain pieces of meadow land in the state. The road has been extended up Snow creek to Lava lakes and Elk lake, within a mile of the summit of the Cascades, directly west of Bachelor Butte and Horse mountain. The lake is noted for its fishing and scenic attractions. It is only a short distance from the proposed Skyline road which is being discussed as following the mountain chain through the state.

The lake is 5000 feet in elevation and of volcanic origin.

The forest service expects to send a man over the region in an airplane to get an impression of the summit before laying out further plans for development of the lake.

Reed College Up To Snuff on Good Reading Material

Rev. W. T. McElveen of the First Congregational church will never again change Reed college with lagging behind. The divine learned a lesson Monday when he addressed Reed chaplains and declared that "Portland ministers had read the latest book on the war, Keynes' Economic Consequences of the War," and the Manchester Guardian, Great Britain's leading paper, but that Reed college had never seen either publication."

Had McElveen seen the facial expression of Miss Ruth B. Compton, Reed librarian, he would have realized his mistake. As it was, when he sat down with the Reed faculty for lunch he saw in the center of the table several copies of the Manchester Guardian and Keynes' recent war book which had been ordered for Professor Charles McKinley of the Reed politics department a month before it had gone to press.

McElveen's remarks about Reed were uttered to prove the progressiveness of the Christian ministry which, he claimed, surpasses even that of educational institutions.

Southern Pacific's Operating Features Being Investigated

Checking up operation and making a general inspection tour of the Southern Pacific lines in Oregon, F. L. Burckhalter, newly appointed assistant general manager of the Northern division of the Southern Pacific, arrived in Portland Tuesday.

CHEAPER COAL FOR PORTLAND PLAN OF SPOKANE ENGINEER

J. W. McBride, a Spokane mining engineer, has placed before the Port of Portland, the commission of public docks and the Chamber of Commerce a proposal for the development of a coal mine about 25 miles from Chehalis, Wash., as a means of securing a large supply of low-priced coal for Portland.

McBride is one of the owners of the mine and represents the majority. According to statements placed by McBride before the public bodies, test tunnels indicate the presence of more than 250,000,000 tons of bituminous or near-bituminous coal underlying a property of approximately 1200 acres. The coal, he says, can be laid down in Portland at a cost basis of \$3 a ton. The coal can be used for steaming and coking as well as for other industrial and domestic purposes, judging by test samples which the mining engineer has exhibited. It is his belief that with control of such a supply of coal could be had in Portland at an average of \$5600 a ship less than on Puget Sound. He also believes that coke derived from the coal could be used to marked advantage in the smelting of middle grade iron ores found abundantly in the vicinity of Portland. The mine is 98 miles from Portland. No railroad as yet reaches it, but rail transportation is said to have been extended to within a comparatively short distance. The freight rate from the region would be less than to Puget Sound.

McBride has also brought the deposit to the attention of the ports of Astoria and Vancouver.

So far as could be learned this morning, steps toward expert examination of the mine have yet to be taken by the port commission, the dock commission or the Chamber of Commerce.

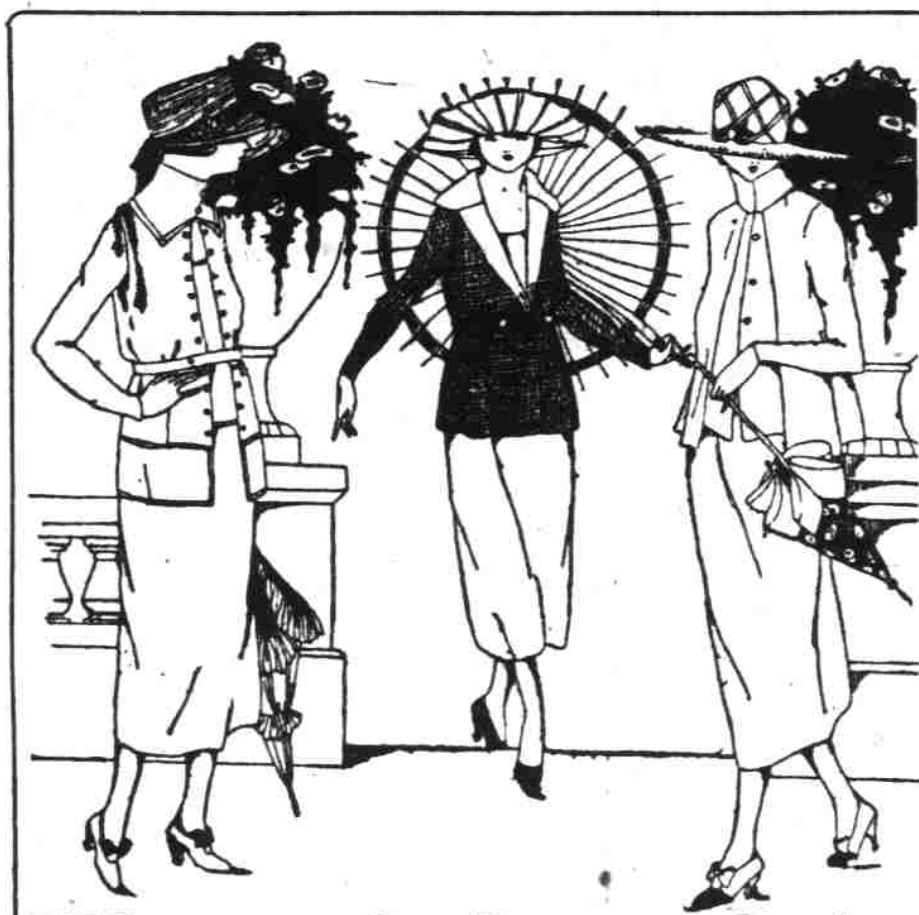
