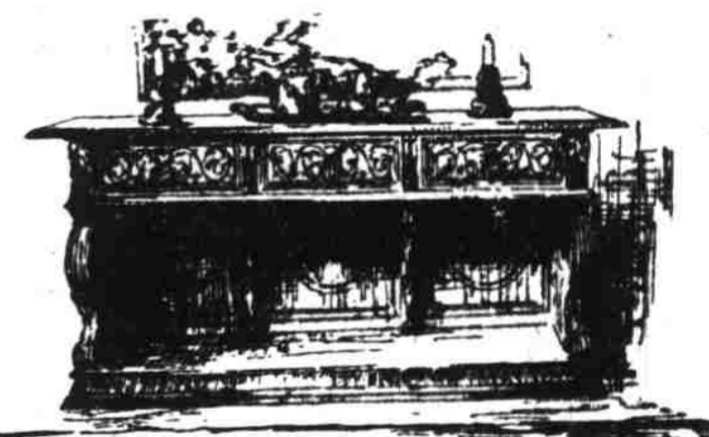

### An Italian Renaissance Dining Room Suite at \$3,875.00

IN BURLINGTON HOUSE (SEVENTH FLOOR) MARKS THE SPRING EXPOSITION OF THE FURNISHING GALLERIES

A SUITE of solid black walnut, massive enough to endure for more than one century—richly hand carved with the acanthus leaf, the scroll and fret designs of 16th-century Renaissance—nobly shaped as though it might have been designed for some palace of the pope or the Medicis of that marvelous period of the world's awakening.



Before the 16th century furniture had been solemn, heavy, unwieldy, uncomfortable. Beginning with 1600, great artists of the Renaissance raised furniture making to an art and for the first time designed it to suit the purpose and character of the owner.

You will notice in this Burlington House suite the imposing chair of the period with the chair cushions a part of the seat, an innovation of Renaissance artists. The long, richly carved sideboard is another origination of the Renaissance mentioned by Benvenuto Cellini. The silver cupboard is rather like the old chests of the Renaissance, but behind the closed carved doors are movable trays for the housewife's linens. The large oblong dining table has the massive carved supports for which one instinctively seeks in anything Renaissance—and the beautiful wall table is distinguished by the same characteristics of the period.

Equally rich furniture is to be had here for the living room, the bedroom and the formal hall, together with the harmonious furnishings, such as carpets, hangings, curtains, pictures, mirrors, lamps, china, glass, linens, silver.

This dining suite of ten marvelous hand-wrought pieces is the product of an American furniture maker. It is an honor to America that Americans can create such beauty—such fine substantial craftsmanship.

No time-worn survival of the actual Renaissance could be more intrinsically valuable than this rarely interesting 20th-century Renaissance suite.
