

JACK AND BEANSTALK GO FROM CHILD LORE; LABORATORY COMES IN

In the old days the children's hour was devoted to grandpa's stories about Jack and the Beanstalk, giants and ghosts. The twentieth century child spends his spare hour in the psychological laboratory, with its formidable array of mental scale rules, brain tape-measures, and scales for weighing mental images. The child there becomes the center of interest for a group of serious investigators.

Binet tests have been administered children by student psychologists at Reed college for the last month. Interesting results were announced in Wednesday's issue of the Reed college Quaker.

Nonsense brought out immediate responses from the youngsters tested. Read the sentence, "A girl, cut into 18 pieces, was found dead in the park. It is thought she committed suicide." The young "patient" objected. "She couldn't—she would be dead before she could cut hardly any of her."

Asked to give as many words as possible in three minutes, one youth started well, began to weaken, and then hit on the novel scheme of reciting numbers, which would technically count as words. Either from a twinge of conscience or the forbidding aspect of his inquisitors, he mentioned a few small digits, burst forth with "a thousand," and then let the numbers rest.

Shown a series of pictures and asked what he saw in them, one trichin dogmatically stated: "Ninety. I can't see nothing in them." After much coaxing he admitted that he could see a "burglar and a woman squeezing a burglar." In a picture of a forlorn old couple huddled together on a park bench. The tests are devised to indicate the child's mental age.

Psychology Is Taken From Required List

Willamette University, Salem, March 26.—According to an announcement by Professor Von Eschen, secretary of the administration, psychology has been taken from the list of subjects required for graduation. This is the result of a request of Professor Sherman, head of the department of philosophy and education, in the belief that the course will be of greater value if not compulsory.
