Lebanon, the list shows, has qualified for the first time, while Dallas, Enterprise and Vale, which appeared in the former list, failed to qualify under the latest report.

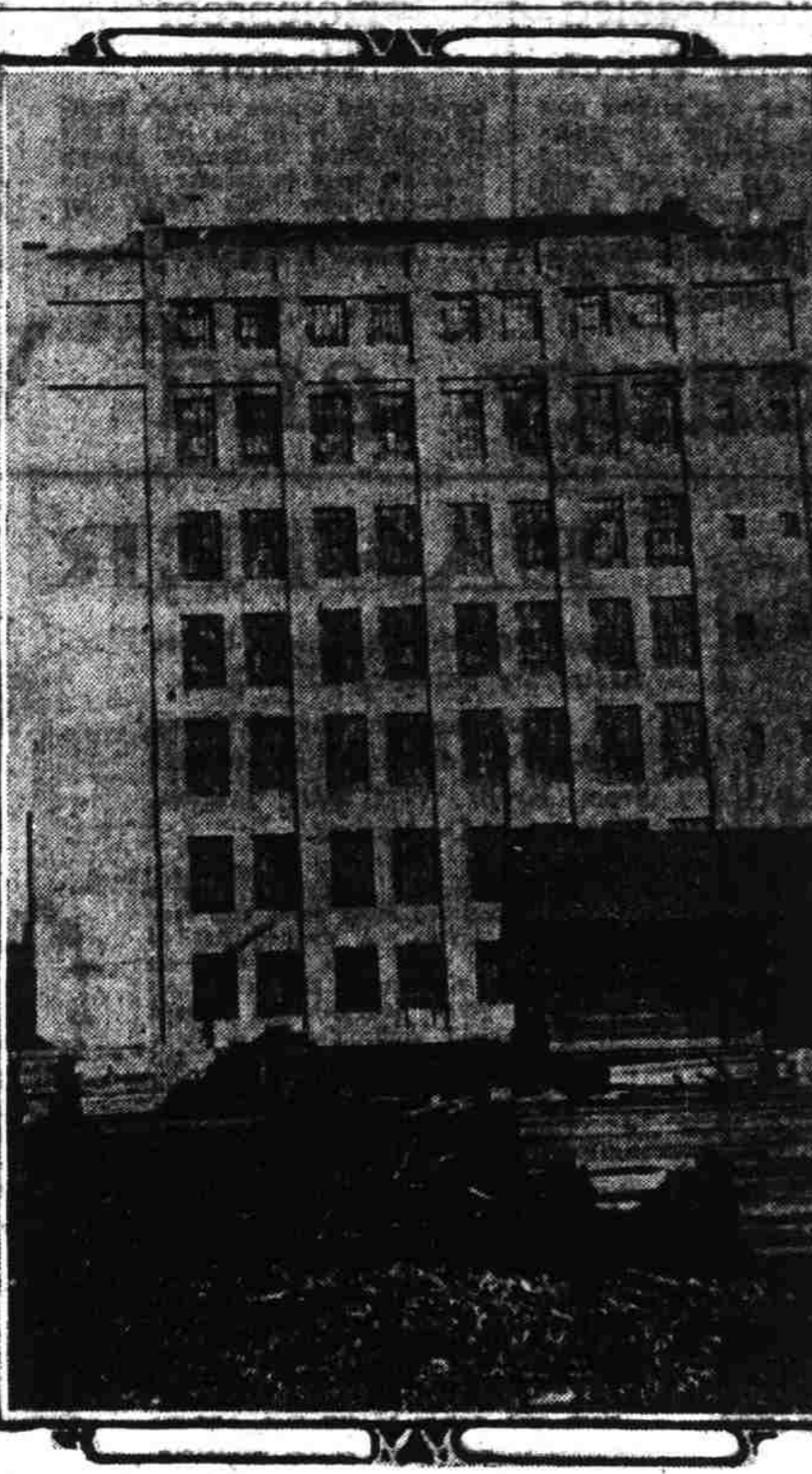
Bristol Elected as Rotarian Governor
