

McNARY JOINS IN APPEAL FOR SHIPS

Washington, April 1.—(WASH-INGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—Senator McNary today addressed Chairman Benson of the shipping board with considerable urgency to give immediate attention to Portland's request for assignment of ships, heretofore presented to W. D. B. Dobson, representing the Chamber of Commerce.

"I understand requests for various steamship services have been forwarded to your Pacific Coast manager for report and recommendation," says McNary. "This is proper, and I have no complaint to make. However, should the report be obscure or unfavorable, I should be happy to have the opportunity to present to you data which will clearly justify requests made and will simply merit your number of vessels to Portland. All I ask is a fair chance to reply to any adverse report, should one be filed."

Appropriation of \$10,000 for Band Concerts Delayed

City Commissioner Bigelow, Wednesday, blocked an emergency ordinance appropriating \$10,000 for municipal band concerts this summer, though Mayor Baker and Commissioners Pier and Barbur spoke strongly for it. The ordinance was introduced today to get quick action on advertising the bids for furnishing park concerts, the emergency clause requiring a unanimous council vote. Accordingly, the project now having a simple majority in the council, will go through as an ordinary ordinance, which will mean passage no sooner than next Wednesday and the delay until May 15 before the city purchasing agent can advertise for bids. Whether or not an adequate schedule can then be worked up will depend on the other engagements of bandmasters, it was said.

Ask Supreme Court To Settle Christian Scientists' Dispute

Boston, April 1.—(I. N. S.)—A new phase of the Christian Science litigation which may reopen the entire controversy developed today when Mr. and Mrs. Edwin A. Krauthoff, formerly of Kansas City, now of Washington, D. C., filed a suit in their own behalf to settle the affairs of the church. The way was left open for other members of the church who may so elect to become parties to the suit. The Krauthoffs ask the supreme court of Massachusetts to uphold the church manual and the system of government and other activities established by Mary Baker Eddy.

Mother Disappears, Leaving Her Little Children at Home

While two small children are at home without a mother, police officers are searching for Mrs. Ruby Bryan, 4410 Sixty-third street southeast, who has been missing since last Friday. The oldest child is not yet 3 years old, and the other just 11 months old, according to a report made to police Wednesday. Mrs. Bryan is described as 32 years old, 5 feet 6 inches tall, weighing 120 pounds, with a light complexion, sandy red hair, and blue eyes. 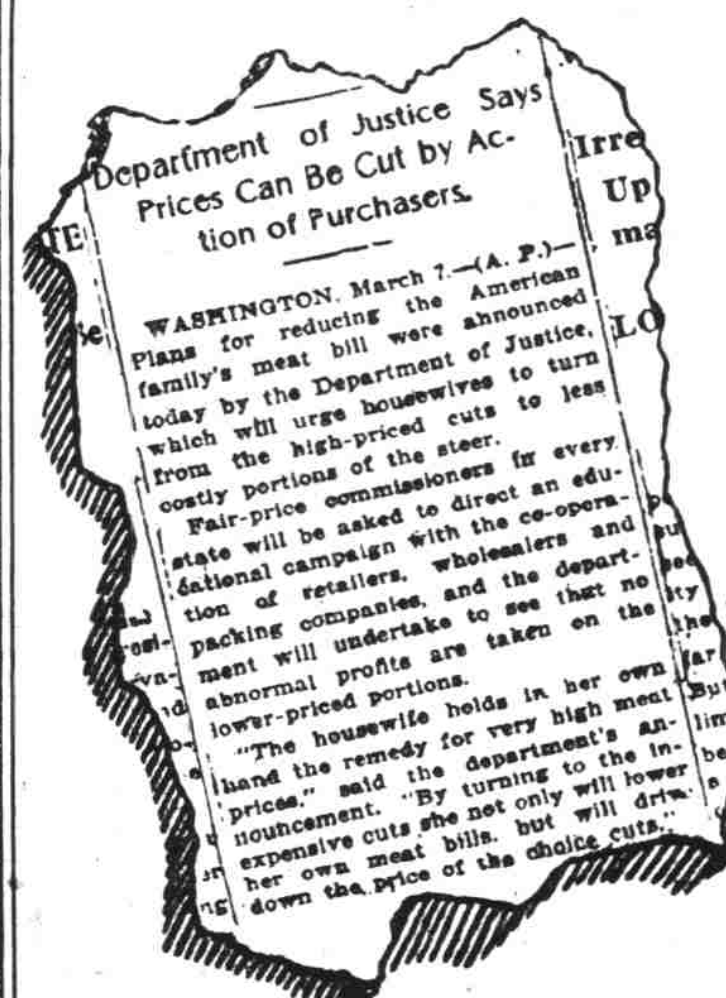
