Stockholm, Sweden, April 1.—Scandinavian newspapers consider the United States senate's rejection of the peace treaty a heavy blow to the League of Nations, involving serious doubts of the league's final influence. Numberless editorial attempts are made to explain the American point of view and to point out the necessity for the senate's lengthy deliberation on lines of party politics, but in every case the conclusion reached is that the immediate future of the league seems hopeless, with the prospect that some of the neutral states may be forced to withdraw.
