WEATHER CONDITIONS
 High pressure prevails on the Pacific coast and in the Central Plains and West Gulf States and lower Mississippi valley. Elsewhere the pressure is low, the principal depressions being central on the middle Atlantic coast and in Western Montana. Precipitation has occurred over a large part of the Northwest, over a belt reaching from about the mouth of the Columbia and in Florida. The heaviest rainfall reported was 1.16 inches at North Head, Washington. Sleet falling in upper Ohio valley, and snow in Wyoming, South Dakota and Tennessee. The temperature is generally above normal on the Pacific slope and on the immediate Atlantic coast, and below normal in other sections. Barometer readings are reported from Middle Western Canada, and from temperature extends southward into Texas. Relative humidity at Portland 8 p. m. yesterday, 87 per cent; 8 p. m. yesterday, 74 per cent; 8 a. m. today, 94 per cent.
 Precipitation since January 1: Total, 9.97 inches; normal, 17.97 inches; deficiency, 8 inches.
