

MARY PICKFORD'S DIVORCE IS TO BE BASIS OF INQUIRY

Carson City, Nev., April 7.—(U. P.)—Any doubt that a thorough inquiry is in store for Mary Pickford's divorce decree was removed today when Judge Langan, who granted the divorce, appeared at the office of Attorney General Fowler and appointment of a special deputy to investigate the whole affair.

Judge Langan had received information of the publication in a California newspaper of a letter written in Douglas county to the effect that rumors of bribery and expenditures of large sums of money in connection with the Pickford divorce are being circulated.

The same letter stated it was believed the investigation would be dropped.

The letter was written by a Gardnerville woman. Judge Langan went immediately to Gardnerville to investigate the matter.

Both Attorney General Fowler and Assistant Attorney General Richards were away from the city when Judge Langan arrived, so he did not submit his formal request for a special deputy to assist Richards in the investigation of the Pickford divorce.

Those in close touch with the attorney general's office gave assurance even before the arrival of Judge Langan that the attorney general will make a thorough investigation. It was learned a suit in the name of the people of Douglas county, where the divorce was granted, would be filed probably within a week to set aside the divorce.

Judge Langan was plainly angered by the published reports intimating fraud.

"The whole affair must be sifted to the bottom," he said. "I shall ask the attorney general to appoint another deputy to investigate the matter."

Declares Hospital Discharges Patients Who Are Not Cured

Washington, April 7.—(U. P.)—Hundreds of ex-service men are being discharged from the public health service hospital in Chicago as "cured," who are not restored to health or made fit for work. H. J. Margolis of Chicago charged in a letter to Representative Madden of Chicago. The letter was read to the house today.

Margolis is an official of the returned soldiers', sailors' and marines' organization, and says he has taken the matter up with the American Legion. His brother, he charges, was one who was forced from lack of proper treatment, and has interrogated personally fully 15,000 other former patients at this hospital.

Major Quinlan, Who Was Commandant at O. A. C., Acquitted

Manila, April 7.—Following a second court-martial trial of Major Dennis P. Quinlan, U. S. A., former judge advocate of the Philippines department, fellow officers of Major Quinlan unofficially said today he had been acquitted. He was charged with embezzlement and conduct unbecoming an officer.

Major Quinlan preceded General McAlexander as commandant of the student cadet corps at Oregon Agricultural college, Corvallis. While there he gained much publicity by an altercation with a student whose face he was accused of slapping. The student was expelled, but later was reinstated by the college authorities.

Daughter Manages Father's Campaign

The woman in this unique role is Miss Sarah S. Butler, who is actively directing the contest of her father, Nicholas Murray Butler, for delegate to the Chicago convention.

RICH GIRL WHO WEDDED CHINAMAN TO CONVERT HIM, IS DISILLUSIONED

Moctezuma, Mexico, April 7.—(U. P.)—Mrs. Sam Joe, formerly Miss Irene Weiser, the daughter of an ex-member of the New York state assembly, hereafter will confine her uplifting of the lowly heathen to Manhattan Island and never, never again will she take on a Chinese husband as an object for her spiritual ministrations.

She said so today, emphatically, while en route to her New York home and mother, after six brief weeks of domestic unrest with her Oriental husband in the wilds of Mexico.

The marriage of Miss Weiser to Sam Joe, a wealthy son of Confucius, was the culmination of a romance in a New York Sunday school, and attracted attention throughout the country.

According to the plans she blissfully outlined at the time, she was first going to convert Sam, and then both were going down into the heart of Mexico to convert everybody needing it.

But Sam, it appears, from Miss

Weiser's disillusioned story today, started off on his Mexican honeymoon still unconvinced and retaining the peculiar ways of the Heathen Chinese which Bret Harte made famous.

Life with Sam, in fact, was just one unconverted thing after another, and finally Mrs. Joe determined to leave him to his own infidel ways, together with the rest of Mexico.

"I wish Sam all the luck in the world," said Mrs. Joe today just before she left on a train for the American border. "But his way of living isn't mine."
