

SOCIETY AIMS TO INCREASE INTEREST IN APPLIED ARTS

The Society for the International Revival of Industrial Arts, whose aim is to stimulate and perpetuate the highest type of work in the applied arts and at the same time offer means of support to thousands of destitute craftsmen abroad, is one of the recent developments of the post-war endeavor in artistic circles of Europe and America.

The society has already been established in London, Paris, Rome and elsewhere with advisory committees composed of public spirited people of prominence, influence and taste, who will help investigate and select, and will give information and advice to those wishing to place orders for art products.

PORTLAND IS HEADQUARTERS
The western organization will be headed by Mrs. Ruth Blake of 711 Prospect Drive, who returned from New York city after a conference with the directors of the New York committee, of which Mrs. William Alexander is chairman. Headquarters will be established in Portland and a department of information will be installed. Among the first exhibitions placed on view by the society in New York was a collection of rugs, fabrics and other works of hand-craftsmanship brought from Morocco by Mrs. Blake and shown at 4 East Fifty-sixth street.

The organization does not propose to act as sales agent for the actual buying and selling of the industrial art products but will establish throughout the states, as it is doing abroad, offices, exhibition rooms and bureaus of information for the benefit of lovers and purchasers of such products.

Drawings, photographs and samples of procurable work which have first been passed upon by the committee and which bear its stamp of approval, will be shown at the various headquarters of the organization. In this way it is expected that through the workman who has kept in touch with society, special orders for decorators, architects, artists and other potential buyers will be secured in the quickest possible way.

PRICES POSTED IN OFFICE
Probable prices, names and addresses through which work may be procured, quickly will be posted in the office. The best means of having finished work delivered or released from the customs houses and forms of letters of inquiry to the various sources of materials will also be available.

Mrs. Alexander is president of the New York committee. Mrs. Nina L. Dursey, vice president, the Equitable Trust company is treasurer and F. Burrell Hoffman is secretary. The English committee includes Lady William Cecil, the Hon. Margaret Amberst, the Hon. Mrs. Walter Long and the Countess of Minto. Many members of the nobility are included among its patrons.

Views Divergent as To the Outlook for Railroad Financing

Two views prevail as to the extent of future railroad financing. First, it is contended that the operation will be difficult on a large scale until the interstate commerce commission indicates what attitude it will take in the way of liberal interpretation or otherwise toward its powers. Second, the issues will have to be "dressed up" to make them attractive.

If equipment bonds or notes are offered on a 7 to 7 1/2 per cent basis, it is believed that buyers will not be difficult to find. The rate, it is held, will have to vary according to the credit standing of the borrower.

The market, in the view of those who have financed large railroad loans, is in no position to take long time flotations, and will not be until it can be demonstrated how the railroads are likely to work out under the new law and what their earnings are destined to be.

Dynamite Used in Fishing Sends Two To Jail Thirty Days

Five violators of the state game laws have been prosecuted, reports received at the fish and game commission offices indicate. E. B. Dickens of Beaver creek in Benton county, was found guilty at Corvallis of killing deer during closed season and fined \$100 and \$20 costs. E. P. Bailey of Astoria was fined \$75 and \$10 costs for allowing 20 to enter the Columbia river.

Roy Pike and Robert Tubbs of Appleton were each sentenced to 30 days in jail and costs of \$25 at Grants Pass for using dynamite in the Applegate river for the purpose of killing fish.

James Anderson of Prairie City was arrested and fined \$25 and costs of \$6.30 for having beaver hides in his possession.

England to Follow America's Example

Should the United States refuse to sell goods to countries that are unable to pay cash, thinks a British financial reviewer, England would have to adopt the same policy, for "our war sacrifices have been so great that we could not carry the burden of Europe alone. Great competition for those markets 'able to do business on a cash basis' would result. Prices would fall heavily and this would precipitate a crisis in those countries able to pay cash," including this country and the United States.

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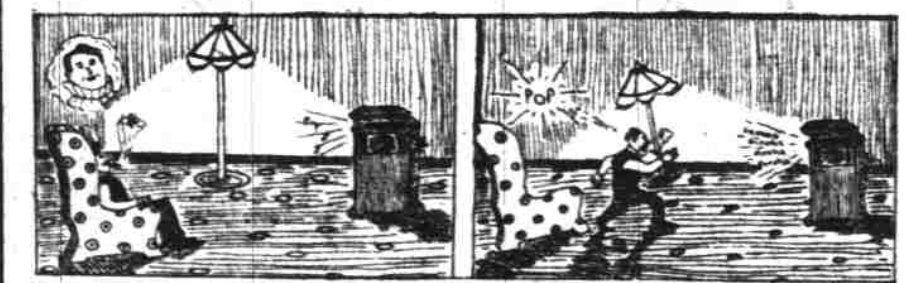
