

BIOLOGIST FINLEY IS HIGHLY HONORED BY GEOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

High honor has been accorded William L. Finley, former Oregon state biologist, by the National Geographic society. In recognition of his remarkable scientific work as a naturalist and motion picture photographer of wild life he has been granted an honorarium by the society which will enable himself and Mrs. Finley, without financial cares, to pursue their studies of wild life throughout the West.

TO PUBLISH RESULTS

He will make his own program and control the use of such films as he makes in the future. Once a year or more, according to the arrangement, the results of his studies will be published in the National Geographic magazine. It has been suggested to him that he turn his attention first to the wild birds and animals that are rapidly disappearing before the encroachments of civilization.

Biologist Finley and his wife have just returned to Portland from an extended and uncommonly successful lecture tour throughout the East. Among other important organizations he addressed and exhibited his motion pictures of wild life in the high Cascades before the National Geographic society in Washington and the American Game Protective association in New York.

WILD BIRD STUDY PLAN

He expects to go soon with Mrs. Finley to Southern California, Arizona and Texas for study of the birds in these states. He will then go to Jackson's Hole, Wyo., one of the most interesting sections, biologically, in the West.

Answering a report that he intended to become a candidate for the state senate under the urgency of a number of his friends, Mr. Finley said: "Running for the legislature is out of my line. I appreciate and thank my friends for their desire that I should be a candidate and for their proffers of support, but I have other things to do which forbid my seeking such preferment. I shall not be a candidate for the state senate."

Methodists Plan to Rebuild Destroyed Willamette U. Hall

A campaign for \$100,000, with which to rebuild Waller hall, partially destroyed by fire last December, and to

finish Lausanne hall at Willamette university, has been undertaken by the members of the Laymen's association of the Oregon conference of the Methodist Episcopal church. Headquarters have been opened in room 505 Platt building. This campaign was decided on by the laymen in their last annual session at

Salem, when the Oregon conference met. But various things arose to cause its postponement. However, the need for the buildings and for a central heating plant is so urgent that a committee, after a careful investigation, recommended action at this time. The campaign will be conducted particularly

among Methodists and other friends of the university and is expected to be completed by the middle of May. A drive is on at The Dalles to raise a \$4500 fund for Y. W. C. A. headquarters. One-third of the money has been already pledged.
