

REWARD IS OFFERED FOR LEADERS OF GERMAN REBELLION

Berlin, April 21.—Many persons in Germany are wondering a little cynically just what punitive measures will be enforced against the leaders of the Kapp episode.
This uprising, it will be remembered, was the signal for the troubles in the Ruhr region, and the French occupation of Frankfurt, so the moral responsibility of its authors is unlimited. I have heard people say that if the government cannot punish Gen von Watter, who tried to corrupt the troops in the west, it will never dare to follow up the others. This morning, however, Herr Dr. Blunck, imperial minister of justice, explained to me the difficulties which stand in the way of the administration.
HIGH TREASON CHARGED
"We have already arrested Freiherr von Falkenhusen, Dr. von Pauli and one other second rate leader," he exclaimed. "They are now in prison in Berlin and will be tried within three or four months. We have done our best to find Dr. Kapp, General von Luetwitz and the rest, but you must remember that they were influential men and they still have many friends. We have issued warrants against 20 different persons and placed a reward of 10,000 marks (normally \$2500) for the capture of each. We have brought the charge of high treason against them. By means of proclamations, I have warned German citizens not to give them aid or subsistence."
"If the fugitives are still in Germany, Herr minister, what is the trouble with the German police force that it cannot find them?" I interrupted.
MAY HAVE FLED
"Ah, but who knows that they are in Germany?" came the reply. "The Danish paper Politiken recently published a report that General von Luetwitz had crossed into Denmark. Dr. Kapp, it is suspected, has taken refuge in East Prussia, the most monarchical province of Germany. Moreover, since the extension of Poland to the Baltic sea East Prussia has become almost the same as a foreign country or colony, and our authority is much weaker there, as the police are few in number. No, you can tell the world that the German government has done its best to catch the Kap-

plists, and will punish them severely if they are found."
In the course of our conversation another matter came up, and that was the cause of the panic on the Berlin bourse on Monday.
CONFISCATION THREATENED
"No law has actually been published for the confiscation of foreign securities in private hands," said the minister, "but one will be soon. The speculators heard of it and plunged into a wild effort to rid themselves of England and French bonds. I wonder if you realize what a blow this treaty clause deals German finance? It is not so much in respect to the obligations we hold against the great western powers, for those were mostly confiscated by the government in the course of the war, but, for instance, with regard to the former German colonies. Before the war we invested much money in German East Africa. That is now British territory, and all securities touching its resources must be delivered into British hands."
"Hard as the measure is, however, we will obey it. We intend to fulfill the Versailles treaty. We have the names of all persons holding foreign securities, and they will soon be summoned to deliver them. Those who refuse will be punished with fines and imprisonment."

AGRARIAN PARTY IN BULGARIA CAPTURES POLITICAL CONTROL

Sofia, Bulgaria, April 9.—(Via Paris, April 21.)—The returns from the general elections for sobranje (assembly) members shows that the agrarian party, led by Premier Stambouliski, obtained 112 seats, the Communists 48, and the Democrats 23. The bourgeoisie parties were literally "put out of the ring," which simply demonstrates that the people have lost all confidence in the old parties owing to the terrible political disorders committed in the last six years.
The followers of ex-Premier Radev-hov had no show in the elections, which were held with a greater degree of freedom than ever before in the history of Bulgaria. Under the present regulations the votes register the people's wishes accurately. The farmers, who compose 82 per cent of the nation, are represented by the agrarian deputies. The Communists elected represent the discontented working classes in the cities, poorly paid state and municipal clerks and other elements such as discharged army officers.
Premier Stambouliski, who will soon reconstruct the cabinet to form a home-generous ministry, will count on the inevitable cooperation of the agrarians and Democrats and hence the Communists will be held firmly under control. With the country's internal administration now formally and actually guaranteed, Premier Stambouliski has carried out his promise to bridge the Socialists. At the polls, too, the country has once more demonstrated that it is made up of "industrious and honest peasants who are inveterate foes of Bolshevism, anarchy and corruption."

RIOT RECORDS ARE BROKEN IN IRELAND

London, April 21.—The last three weeks have broken all records in the history of Ireland for turbulence, widespread disorders and clashes, according to statistics compiled by Sinn Feiners in a propaganda bulletin which has just been issued.
For the week ending Easter, a record number of raids is reported by the propaganda bulletin, which asserts that 1113 were made by the police and military during that period. The Sinn Feiners claim that April 3 was the record day, when 513 raids were made.
SINN FEINERS UNHINDERED
On other days the number of raids ran from 100 to 200. The statistics claim 103 arrests were the total for the week. "Acts of aggression" for the week were cited by the bulletin, numbering 1310.
The figures do not cover "acts of aggression" by the Sinn Feiners, which would probably run into the hundreds. The bulletin gives details of raids, claiming that on April 3 the police and military carried out wholesale raids in the counties of Dublin, Cavan, Donegal, Kilkenny, Sligo and Tipperary. Over 300 houses were entered and searched in these counties, it is asserted, while over 200 houses were similarly searched in County Cork.
NO ADDITIONAL TROOPS
For the week before Easter the bulletin shows 584 acts of aggression by the police and military. On the other hand, although statistics are not yet available, the Sinn Feiners are declared to have taken aggressive action at nearly 250 different points on April 4 alone.
Senar Law is authority for the statement that there is no doubt but that small arms are being smuggled into Ireland, but that nothing is known of any recent gun-running. The war office has declared that the movement of three regiments of cavalry to Ireland was not for the purpose of reinforcing detachments already there, but for replacement due to depletion caused by demobilization.

The Swedish government is willing that the disgruntled workmen should try the experiment and is now making arrangements for committees representing those who have registered to go to Russia to investigate conditions.
