

AKRON GAINS OVER 200 PER CENT IN ITS POPULATION

Washington, April 21.—(I. N. S.)—Preliminary population figures were issued today by the census bureau as follows:

Akron, Ohio, 1920 population, 208,435; increase since 1910, 139,368 or 201.8 per cent.

Mansfield, Ohio, 1920 population 27,824; increase since 1910, 7056, or 34 per cent.

Delaware, Ohio, 1920 population 4756; decrease since 1910, 320 or 3.5 per cent.

Tarentum, Pa., 1920 population 8254; increase since 1910, 1511, or 20.4 per cent.

Wellston, Ohio, 1920 population 6887; decrease since 1910, 188, or 2.7 per cent.

Wichita, Kas., 1920 population 72,128; increase since 1910, 19,678, or 37.5 per cent.

Franklin, Pa., 1920 population 9970; increase since 1910, 293, or 2.1 per cent.

Greenville, Pa., 1920 population 8101; increase since 1910, 2192, or 37.3 per cent.

Rankin, Pa., 1920 population 7301; increase since 1910, 1259, or 20.8 per cent.

Dedham, Mass., 1920 population 10,783; increase since 1910, 1499 or 16.1 per cent.

If Geddes Is Right, Why Do Rifles Rule Ireland?—De Valera

Vicksburg, Miss., April 21.—(I. N. S.)—Eamon De Valera, "president of the Irish republic," today gave out this statement regarding the interview attributed to Sir Auckland Geddes, the new British ambassador to the United States:

"The new British ambassador's statement that, in this generation, there is no quarrel between England and Ireland is a splendid illustration of the impudent audacity of British statesmen when lying will serve their purpose. If there is no quarrel between Ireland and England today, what is the meaning of the British army of occupation on Irish soil? With its daily arriving reinforcements; with its field artillery; its tanks, its bombing planes; that poison and liquid. It requires two to make a quarrel. How naive of the British envoy to suggest that the robber who holds his victim's property at the pistol point is not a party to a quarrel."

THRACIAN REBELS RAID VILLAGES

Constantinople, April 19.—(Delayed)—(I. N. S.)—New disorders have broken out in Thrace. Followers of Jafar Yavari are raiding villages and looting banks, according to information received here today. The Thracian reactionaries signify their separation from the sultan by abandoning the fez and adopting black caps.

(Thrace is the district of Turkey north of the Sea of Marmora and the Aegean sea that was allotted to Greek sovereignty.)

Sec. Lane's Daughter Married in Capital

S.)—One of the most brilliant weddings of the social season in the national capital took place Tuesday afternoon when Miss Nancy Lane, daughter of former Secretary of the Interior and Mrs. Franklin K. Lane, and Philip C. Kaufman of Washington, were married at Old St. Johns church. Mrs. Woodrow Wilson with cabinet members were guests.

Maria L. Sanford Is Found Dead in Bed

Washington, April 21.—(I. N. S.)—Maria L. Sanford, professor emerita of the University of Minnesota, was today found dead in bed, at the home of Senator Knute Nelson here, where she had been staying as a guest during attendance at the congress of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

EX-SERVICE MEN TELL STARTLING STORIES OF HOSPITAL TREATMENT

Chicago, April 21.—Stories of ex-soldiers regarding mistreatment received in Chicago public health service hospitals on their return from France startled Lieutenant Colonel William S. Herriberry, conducting an investigation.

Hyman Margolis acquired a bunion in his travels with the 132d infantry in France, he testified.

"I went to the general hospital here for treatment," he said. "The bunion was removed all right, but my foot never worked right again. The hospital authorities told me I was ready for discharge. I said I wasn't and refused to sign my discharge papers. They took my clothes away from me and called a police ambulance and I was taken to the station in my pajamas."

The hospital officials denied the story and said Margolis' feet were all right, but he stayed in bed 60 days and refused to exercise them.

Peter Kamar, another veteran, testified his appendix was removed without his permission.

"I had to have a little operation," he said. "When I woke up they showed me my appendix in a bottle. Nothing was the matter with it and I never told anybody to touch it."
