

SALARY RISES HELD GREATEST NEED OF LIBRARY EMPLOYEES

Extension of sick leave to library employees from 30 to 90 days as proposed in a committee report to the library board Wednesday night was referred back to the committee upon the recommendation of Zulema Kostomitsky, acting librarian, that greater stress should be laid upon salaries than upon sick leave at the present time.

The library does a great deal of well-fare work among its employees, and in addition to the present 30 days' sick leave, which is greater than that allowed in other cities, the employees have a month's vacation every year, explained Miss Kostomitsky.

Letters recently sent out to newly-naturalized citizens by the library, inviting them to use the institution, has brought considerable response, according to the monthly report submitted to the board. One Greek in East Portland suggested that American-born citizens should go through the same course of instruction before they be permitted to vote as the foreign born, claiming that since taking the prescribed course in Americanization, he was much better informed than many native born citizens.

Resolutions of regret at the death of Mary Frances Isom were unanimously adopted.

The resolution said: "Her genius lay in discovering new and better ways of attracting people to the library, in developing its system to fill wider needs and in making it a necessary part of public and private life. This she accomplished by her professional ability, her tact and courtesy, her wide sympathies and, above all, by a confidence in all whom she met."
