

PARIS POLICE AND ROVODY ELEMENTS CONTINUE RIOTING

Fifteen Additional Gendarmes and 30 More Civilians Wounded in Fighting in Streets of City.

Paris, May 1.—Complete collapse of the railway strike following the flat refusal of the Federation of Labor to sanction "an act which would plunge the republic into the throes of civil war," was the principal feature of "May day" in Paris. A splendidly efficient police organization is tonight smothering the embers which for a time threatened to burst into flames of open rebellion.

Paris, May 2.—(1:40 a. m.)—(U. P.)—Desultory rioting continued here today with frequent encounters between rowdies and the police. Fifteen additional police were wounded. Snipers were firing in the dark streets. Thirty additional persons had been wounded, according to the police. Two women were civilians wounded in renewed rioting, marking radical demonstrations during the celebration of May day. News agency reports said four of the persons injured in Saturday afternoon's rioting were dead. Despite the apparent seriousness of the situation, with reports that several persons had been killed, well informed observers believed the affair was less serious than the riot of last May day, at least from a political standpoint.

PORTLAND IS PEACEFUL ON MAY DAY; NO OUTBREAKS
As a measure of "preparedness" against any possible May day demonstrations by radicals Chief of Police V. Jenkins kept about 75 extra police officers on duty Saturday; but nothing unusual occurred. May day in Portland was peaceful as a June day, and the officers awaiting any possible emergency call assembled in their clubrooms, playing games or with reading and any other pastime. The first night relief, which usually goes on duty at 4:10 in the afternoon, was called in to headquarters at 1 o'clock. The night shift of the auto theft department worked extra from 3 o'clock in the morning until 4 in the afternoon. The entire day relief corps remained at the station in the evening and returned on duty until after midnight.

London, May 1.—(U. P.)—A Rome dispatch early today said a guard was killed and many workers killed or injured in May day clashes between guards and laborites at Turin late yesterday.

well yesterday. "Evidence of a complete disappearance is all that is required to convince the court that Descamps has been disposed of and that by means foul."

ANOTHER CASE RECALLED
In the case of Alma Nesbit and her mother, who dropped from view 30 miles south of Hood River in March, 1919, and for the murder of whom Norman Williams was hanged in The Dalles four years later, corpus delicti was established by a bloody gunny sack and two strands of human hair.

Among recent cases of disappearance is the peculiar one of Henry French. French vanished at Monte Cristo, Wash., in July, 1918. No trace of him was ever found. Search was made for three months and not even his lunch bucket was discovered. The court took evidence of affidavits, and admitted the case to probate. The insurance companies paid the claims with one exception. Suit followed, but the claim was settled out of court.

VENGEANCE BELIEVED MOTIVE
That Descamps was murdered, and in a spirit of vengeance, is the opinion of all who have taken an interest in the case. The last seen of the man whose fate is locked in the present mystery was on the corner of Fourth and Yamhill streets in the morning of February 5.
