

SOLDIERS ALLOWED CIVILIAN WAGE MAY NOT RECEIVE AID

Washington, May 6.—(WASH.-INGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—One of the many questions which has arisen in connection with proposed bonus legislation for soldiers of the war with Germany is whether, if such a bill is passed, it should include within its benefits those who were given civilian pay during their service in the army.

DIFFERENCE ARISES

The payment of civilian wages to men who worked in the spruce production operations of the Pacific Northwest has been made a matter of controversy in the Frear report. Representative Frear, head of the house committee which conducted the investigation of that activity, even declared that granting of more than soldier pay was illegal. To this the rejoinder is made that this was a necessary step because of the difficulties of attempting to pay different scales to soldiers and civilians working alongside at the same task.

The same conditions existed in a large degree in the Southern states, where considerable forces of soldiers were used in logging and the same policy was adopted as in Oregon and Washington. It is now proposed by some that whatever bonus legislation is passed, if any, shall exclude those who received more than regular army pay.

Train Derailed After Muskrats Dig Under Tracks

Sioux Falls, S. D., May 6.—(I. N. S.)—Muskrats so undermined the right of way of the Minneapolis & St. Louis railroad at a point near Halley Falls, S. D., that a passenger train was derailed there Wednesday. Collapse of a portion of the roadbed due to the undermining caused the wreck. The locomotive and four foremost cars left the rails and dropped into the mud. There were no casualties.

Von Brincken Gets His First Papers

San Francisco, May 6.—(I. N. S.)—Wilhelm von Brincken, former military attaché of the German consul here, has been granted first papers of citizenship in United States district court. Von Brincken served a term at McNeill's Island Federal prison for conspiracy in the Hindu plot cases.

Hood River, May 6.—R. Clay Crawford, alleged confidence man, who, posing as an ace of the American and Canadian air forces, secured a position as physical instructor in the high school here in Peltusky, and decamped after securing money from faculty and students to transport his monoplane to this city from Spokane, and to secure band instruments for a school band, lies in a hospital at Minneapolis, Minn., after an attempt to commit suicide.

Roseburg Council Names Committee To Beautify City

Roseburg, May 6.—Napoleon Rice, ex-mayor and president of the Roseburg Realty board, was appointed by the city council as chairman of a board to beautify the city. His first acts will be to clean up the parkings, beautify public grounds with trees and shrubbery, keep the exhibit building at the depot in trim, and initiate a movement for well kept lawns.

To give better protection from fire hazards, an ordinance has been passed requiring that all moss covered roofs be cleaned at once.

Accused of Aiding Escape of Two Girls

Chehalis, Wash., May 6.—Ed Berg was arrested in Tacoma by Deputy Sheriff Roberts and brought to Chehalis, charged with aiding two girls to escape from the training school for girls at Grand Mound. Two soldiers were arrested a few days ago on the same charge. Allen Martin was before Justice Beaufort Tuesday on this charge and released after he had paid a fine of \$15 and costs.

Aberdeen Chief Named

Aberdeen, Wash., May 6.—Frank O'Brien, who has been captain of police and acting chief of police since the resignation of George Dean, who moved to Oregon, was appointed chief of police by Mayor Sargent Wednesday. The mayor reappointed all other officials who have served under him the past three years. Five new members of the council of twelve being also sworn into office.

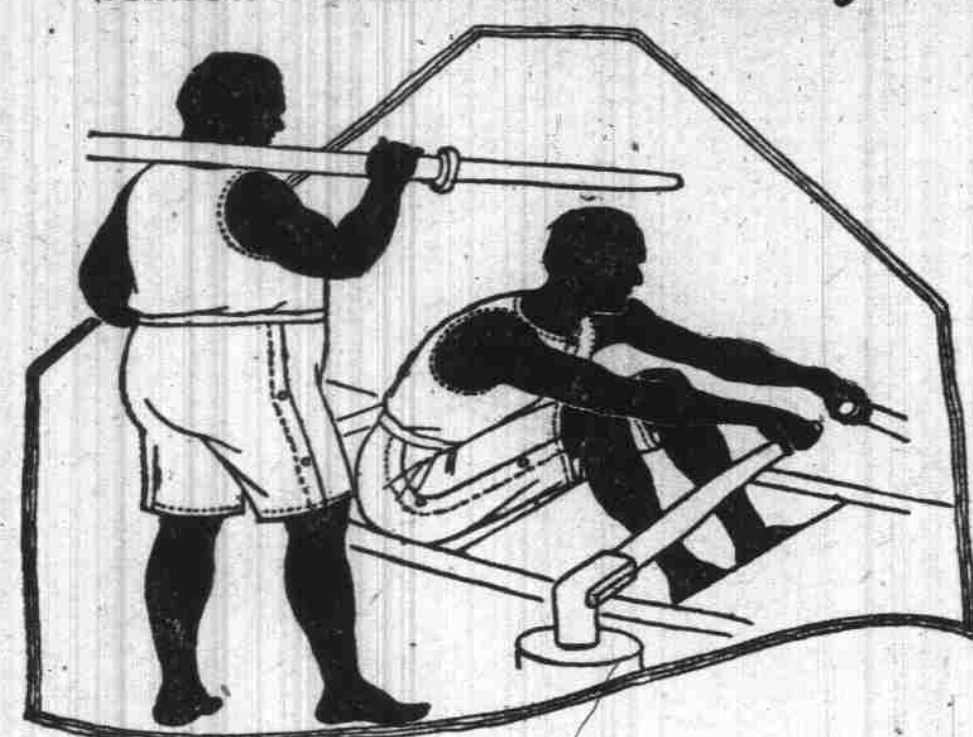
around them the wreckage of a gin mill. Windows were broken for yards around by the force of the explosion.
