

SQUARE DEAL FOR ALL PORTS OBJECT OF McNARY PLAN

Washington, May 6.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)—Carrying out his recently announced purpose to secure recognition in merchant marine legislation of the natural advantages of ports and the economies which will result from using direct rail and ocean lines, Senator McNary has formulated an amendment which comprehensively covers that subject. The shipping board is directed to make investigation of all the factors entering into a "square deal," to advise with cities and communities concerning the location of terminals, and if it finds that existing rates or regulations of railroads are detrimental to the natural flow of traffic, it is directed to report its findings to the interstate commerce commission, which is directed to take appropriate action to correct such conditions.

1800 Electricians Strike; Expect a General Walkout

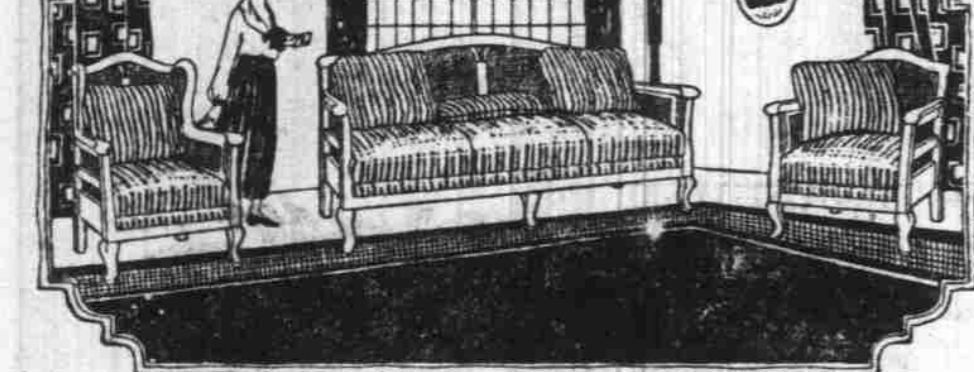

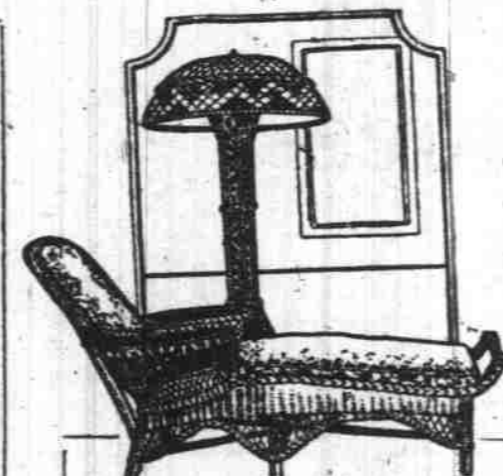
