

GOOD WEATHER AND GREEN STUFFS ARE NOW THE FAVORITES

With warmer weather the housewife and the rest of the family sigh for more greens on the table. The markets are getting quite well supplied with green stuffs and there has of late been a disposition to put prices down a few fractions.

While spinach continues the chief of the green market at this time and sales are being made down to 10 cents a pound for fresh offerings, asparagus is taking second place and will soon be the leader.

Within a short time it is believed that sufficient asparagus will be available to bring down values on the local product, which is still high. However, retailers are now getting stocks of Walla Walla green grass in liberal lots and this is priced so that the average store is able to sell to consumers at 15 cents a pound. This should quickly put the canned stock off the table.

Radishes are coming forward in liberal supply, but consumers are using them so freely that prices are holding high.

Cabbage prices are slightly lower and somewhat better quality is arriving from California.

New potatoes are holding about unchanged and this has helped the demand for old stock.

New onions are lower in price, but they are still high as compared with old crop Oregon.

Mexican tomatoes are very high priced at this time because of the great loss by spoilage due to the delays in transportation.

Green and wax beans as well as peas are coming forward rather freely from the South and are lower in price.

A very liberal drop has been noted in the price of head lettuce.

The following prices are average ones that consumers are expected to pay retail shops. Quality noted is the average, fancy stuff being slightly higher, and inferior stuff fractionally lower.

Peas—Fresh, 45¢ @ 47¢ per dozen; fancy fresh, 45¢ @ 48¢ per dozen.

Peas—Dressed, 45¢ per pound; turkey, 50¢ @ 56¢ per pound; dried, 46¢ per pound.

Peas—Salmon, 25¢ @ 30¢ per pound; halibut, 25¢ @ 30¢ per pound.

Peas—Patent, 33.00 @ 4.00 per sack 40 pounds.

Potatoes—Burbank, fancy, 9¢ @ 10¢ per pound; sweet, 12¢ @ 14¢ per pound.

Onions—Dried, 3¢ @ 4¢ per pound.
