

## LEGION'S BIG PUSH FOR MEMBERS TO OPEN ON MAY 17

Full Week Will Be Devoted to Enlisting the 1,500,000 Men and Women Not Yet Enrolled.

Three million men and women in the United States are eligible to become members of the American Legion by virtue of service in the army, navy or marine corps during the war. There are already close to 1,500,000 members.

With this consideration in view, the Legion will inaugurate a mammoth campaign, a "push" Monday, May 17, to last during the week, in which it is hoped that the ex-service people who are still out of the fold will be in the minority instead of the majority.

The great American public, which has borne the brunt of scores of "drives" in the last three years, will be called upon to aid, but it will be pleasant and painless aid. The public will be called upon only to exhibit its friendship and not its pocketbook.

**NO MONEY ASKED**  
For the legion seeks not a cent in contributions. The campaign slogan for each member will be for him to secure two more. It is desired, however, to interest every American in the "push" because the organization's principles are the interests of the country.

That the general public feels this is true is shown by the way prominent men have come forward to pledge their aid, says the bulletin of the legion on the subject of the "push" which has just been received from headquarters. Lieutenant General Robert L. Bullard, commanding the department of the east, has included recognition of the "push" in general orders and General Pershing has also endorsed the campaign.

Welfare and civic organizations have endorsed the "push" and have volunteered to lend speakers and equipment to help make it a success. An active contest will be made during the week to interest the hundreds of thousands of men and women who approve of the legion and who have intended to join it, just like they intend to take out insurance or write their wills.

**WANT ALL ELIGIBLES**  
These folks have been branded "victims of inertia" and determined efforts to land them in membership will be made. Active work in securing memberships of eligible men now in the army, navy and marine corps will be made by the posts adjacent to military camps.

The nation wide "push" is expected to reach men in the most inaccessible places. Any 15 ex-service men can form their own post by getting together and applying to national headquarters for application blanks. It is believed that no locality is so thinly settled that it cannot secure 15 former fighters, who can band together for social and legion purposes.

Incidentally, the campaign will reach into the far corners of the earth. Already the legion has posts in 14 foreign countries, and these outposts of Americanism are expected to join in the "push" and extend the legion's frontiers.

## Public Is Invited To Visit Terminal No. 4 at St. Johns

Today will be "open house" at Municipal terminal No. 4, St. Johns. Members of the commission of public docks Saturday issued a formal invitation to the public to visit the big new terminal and see at first hand just how great Portland's new maritime activity is becoming.

The dock and the warehouses and wharves composing the terminal will be busy, indeed, and give visitors a vivid idea of what is going on, declared Secretary Randall of the dock commission. Two big trans-Pacific freighters will be loading cargo for the Orient. One is the Abercrombie, which recently discharged goods from the Far East, and the other is the Meiko Maru, a Japanese ship, which is taking on products of Oregon for shipment to Japan.

Randall announced that almost every phase of activity at the terminal will be in full operation, with opportunity to see the big oil storage tanks and bulk grain elevator, the electric cranes, the modern hoists, and all other gear of a modern establishment.

Although the St. Johns carline is about one mile from the terminal the new county automobile road leads direct to it and is in good condition. Plenty of room for parking automobiles is available near the municipal plant.

## Lever Act Target In Effort to Free Miners, Operators

Indianapolis, Ind., May 8.—(U. P.)—After hearing exhaustive arguments on the constitutionality of the Lever food fuel control law, Judge A. B. Anderson, in the United States district court here tonight, took under advisement a motion to quash the indictment naming 135 coal miners and operators for alleged violation of the law.

The arguments against the law were delivered by Charles Evans Hughes, chief counsel for the defense. He declared the Lever law was class legislation.

Dan W. Simms, special United States district attorney, maintained that the act was "broad and must be given a broad interpretation," and that if the court found any one sentence of it inoperative, that did not invalidate the other parts of it. This law, he said, was enacted to deal with such conditions as should arise from a coal strike.

## Women and Legion To Meet Same Time

Spokane, Wash., May 8.—(U. P.)—Decision to call a conference of women's auxiliaries to meet concurrently with the state legion convention in Spokane, September 3, 4 and 5, was reached here today by the state executive committee, meeting in conjunction with a general Northwest conference. The committee recommended on a program to be followed in fighting for the state soldiers' bonus, now up to a referendum vote.

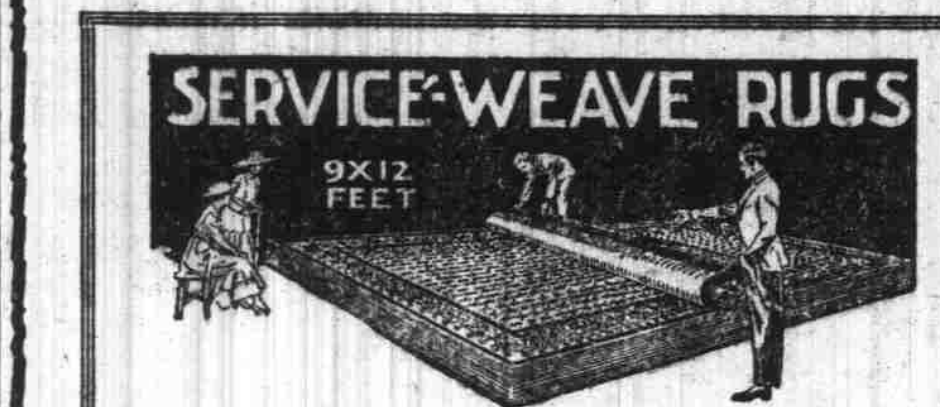
The program of the day includes a picnic, games, exhibition drills by the girls
