

JUNKET EXPENSE IS QUESTIONED IN SUIT

Roseburg, May 12.—W. H. Jewett of Gardiner has brought suit for injunction against Warren P. Reed, John R. Browne and C. McC. Johnson of Reedsport to restrain them from paying out Port of Umpqua funds to Reed and Browne on their claim for expenses on a recent trip to Washington in behalf of the port. Several months ago Commissioner C. E. Hicker, Browne and Reed made a trip to Washington to urge legislation for funds to complete the jetty at the mouth of the Umpqua.

Since that trip Commissioner Hicker died and C. McC. Johnson has been acting as president, having been elected over the protests of Commissioners Fred Weatherly and Dr. E. W. Sterns at the meeting for the election of a new president. Weatherly was president officer, having been vice president of the port, and the vote being a tie, his vote was not counted and Johnson was declared elected. It is over the election, which some of the members of the port declare is illegal, that the suit was filed. Other charges are that the claims for expenses were not itemized, as is customary. Expenses of \$2000 were allowed but the commissioners claim they spent \$2421 and the claim of the \$421 is being held up.

Pendleton, May 12.—Fred P. Austin, for two years superintendent of schools, resigned Monday night, effective at the close of the school next month. H. E. Inlow, principal of the high school, was elected to the vacancy for two years. Austin will take a position in Arizona. Inlow was superintendent at Forest Grove before coming here two years ago. No successor in his place has been chosen.

Applications for O.-C. Grant Lands Approximate 500

Roseburg, May 12.—With the close of business Saturday, approximately 500 applications had been filed in the Roseburg land office for Oregon & California grant lands. Of these, about 50 were people claiming preferential rights by reason of settlement previous to December 1, 1913. More than 50 per cent of all applications filed were by citizens of Oregon, and the greater part of these are residents of Douglas county.

A drawing will be held on May 14. Probably more than 150 applications are free of any conflict, and such applications will be allowed. Ex-service men continue to have preferential right of filing until July 8.

Toledo, Or., May 12.—Near tragedies happened in quick succession in the lives of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Loomis, Sunday. Near Chitwood their automobile went over the grade into Simpson creek. Both were caught under the car but Loomis extricated himself. Mrs. Loomis was pinned face down in the water.

Loomis secured help and Mrs. Loomis was released, apparently dead. First aid measures were successful and she was carried to a farm house. While a doctor was attending her the house caught fire and was saved only by heroic work by neighbors. A big hole was burned in the roof. Mrs. Loomis is considered out of danger.

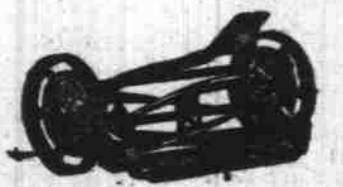
