

MARKET DIRECTOR FOR OREGON, NEW BILL PROPOSED

The market commission bill, creating the office of state market director to aid producers and consumers and shorten the road between them, has been drawn. It will be sent to Salem for ballot title tonight, and petitions to place it on the November ballot will be put in circulation under auspices of the State Taxpayers' league within 10 days, it is announced.

The bill creates the state market commission, composed of the market director and a secretary. The director to receive a salary of \$4000 a year, and \$50,000 is appropriated for use of the commission until December 31, 1922.

PURPOSE OF MEASURE

To act as adviser for producers, consumers and distributors, assisting them in economical and efficient distribution of products at fair prices. To gather and disseminate information concerning supply, demand, prevailing prices and commercial movements, including common and cold storage of products. To promote and encourage organization and operation of cooperative and other associations for improving conditions and services among producers, distributors and consumers and to protect and conserve the interests of producers and consumers.

between producers, distributors and consumers. To certify warehouse receipts and samples of products and to verify quantities and qualities.

To issue labels bearing the seal of the commission. To act on behalf of consumers in conserving and protecting their interests.

To improve and extend distribution and sale of Oregon products throughout the world.

To disseminate through a monthly bulletin information as to the supply, demand, cost of production and prevailing prices of products and the amount in common or cold storage.

To supervise cooperative associations of corn producers and consumers of the best available markets.

WOULD INSPECT BOOKS. The market director is clothed with authority to inspect books and records of warehouses and common carriers.

Maximum punishment for violation of the act is fixed at \$1000 fine, one year imprisonment, or both.
