

SINNOTT ATTACKS PARSON OPPONENT AS PREVARICATOR

Washington, May 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—Representative Sinnott Wednesday made a speech in the house flaying his opponent for nomination, the Rev. Owen F. Jones, as a "prevaricating parson" because of a campaign circular Jones is said to be circulating in The Dalles and elsewhere, which assails Sinnott for his vote on the railroad bill, armed ship amendment and other measures.

Sinnott's characterization of his opponent was several times interrupted by applause and laughter. Introducing his more detailed reply concerning his record he said, in part:

I have as an opponent an unusual personage, a rare bird, seldom seen or heard; a prevaricating parson, who is distributing an ambiguous and anonymous circular which mendaciously misrepresents not only myself, but many Republican and Democratic members of the Sixty-fourth congress.

This circular also misrepresents all Republican members of the Sixty-fifth congress, as well as many Democrats. I would not dignify it with a notice did it not impute disloyalty to my government. In proper circles this gentleman is an advocate of government ownership and operation of railroads. He was therefore an honored guest of the Plumb Plan league banquet at Baker on March 18.

In agricultural sections he soft pedals on government ownership and operation and goes in high to advertise his membership in the Farmers' union. The National grange as well as the Farmers' union petitioned congress to return the railroads to private ownership. I voted to return them. I want to take this occasion to expose this impostor. My opponent may ride either horse alone—government ownership and operation or private ownership. He may ride the Plumb plan horse or the horse of the Farmers' union and National grange, but he cannot ride both horses at once, even though he were the Colossus of Rhodes. The spread is too great.

Sinnott inserted in the Congressional Record the campaign circular and statement of his position on each point.

Sinnott's Klamath Indian Measure Is Temporarily Blocked

Washington, May 13.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL.)—Representative Sinnott's bill to permit the Klamath Indians to submit their

contentions concerning the boundaries of the Klamath reservation to the court of claims came before the house a few days ago, and was refused consideration upon objection by Representative Walsh of Massachusetts.

Sinnott returned the same night from a trip to Oregon, where he was called by the death of his brother, and at a later date will try to secure action on the bill, which involves a large amount of damages for land alleged to have been lost to the Indians because of error in the location of the reservation boundaries.

Jury Disagrees in Physician's Trial

Helena, Mont., May 13.—Standing eight for conviction and four for acquittal, the jury in the case of Dr. H. P. Ratnville, charged with the murder of Mrs. Agnes J. Smith through an attempt to perform an illegal operation, reported to Judge E. Lee Wednesday that they could not come to an agreement. They were out 46 hours. The jury was dismissed. County Attorney J. R. Wine, who conducted the prosecution for the state, said that the case would be retried at the next term of court.


