

THREE OF CREW ARE BLAMED FOR S. P. DISASTER

Silas K. Willett, dead engineer; Augustin Pharis, conductor, and W. H. Flach, brakeman of electric train No. 124, which figured in the fatal collision with train No. 107 just east of Bertha switches Sunday, were equally responsible for the accident which resulted in the loss of nine lives and injury of more than 70 persons.

This was the opinion rendered by the official board called by the Southern Pacific company to investigate the cause of the wreck. The board concluded its work Thursday evening. No recommendations were made "as existing rules fully cover."

Members of the official board were A. T. Mercier, superintendent of the S. P.; Dan M. McLaughlin, master mechanic; H. M. Lull, division engineer; H. P. Coffin, of the Portland public safety commission and Robert E. Smith, president of the Title & Trust company.

ALL PHASES INVESTIGATED

Every possible phase of the accident was treated by the board. Orders, equipment, car structure, air brakes and operating rules were found to be in good condition. Official conclusions of the board read as follows:

"It is the opinion of this board that Engineer Silas K. Willett, Conductor Augustin Pharis and Brakeman W. H. Flach, train No. 124, were equally responsible for the accident on account of their failure to observe train order form No. 304, dated May 9, 1920, which required them to hold main track clear of the east switch at Bertha and meet train No. 107."

WILLETT IS COMMENDED

Reviewing the past service of Willett the board said: "We find that he had been attentive to his duties, interested in his work and was considered very efficient by his supervising officers. He was particularly interested in safety work."

The board also expressed the opinion that the work of Pharis had been above reproach.

In speaking of the manner in which the train crew observed the passage of Bertha switches the report says: "We conclude that Conductor Pharis did not attempt to go forward until he heard exhaust of air and after emergency application was made."

PEEBLER PASSENGER ON 107

Frederick Peebler, Southern Pacific motorman, who was instantly killed in the fatal electric train collision Sunday morning near Bertha station, was a passenger on bound outbound train No. 107 and was riding on the front platform with Motorman R. A. Eland, according to definite testimony introduced to the railroad board. It had been stated at various times that Eland was a passenger on inbound train No. 124 and that he was probably talking to Motorman Willett at the time of the accident.

Fisherman Hauled Before Judge for Snagging Salmon

Fred Frederic of Oregon City was arrested Wednesday by A. E. Burghdurf, state game warden, and Joe Craig, deputy, at the falls at Oregon City, for snagging salmon contrary to state game laws, and was fined \$50 at Oak Grove Thursday. Frederic will be brought before the court at Oak Grove on an additional charge of resisting an officer, as he put up a strenuous fight before he was captured.

Tony Klarach, who was arrested April 28 by Ed Clark, deputy warden, charged with transporting salmon illegally caught, forfeited his bail amounting to \$50 by not appearing for trial this week.

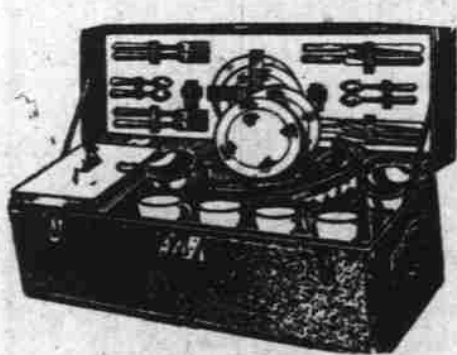
