

AMERICAN LEGION SECURES ROOMS IN FLATIRON BUILDING

The second floor of the Flatiron building at Sixth and Ankeny streets has been secured as clubrooms for the American Legion, Commander James O. Conville announced at the meeting Monday night, and Portland post No. 1 voted to lease the quarters until January 1, 1921, with every possibility that the quarters will be continued permanently.

Reading room, billiard and pool rooms and other club conveniences will be installed for the post, and will be open by July 1, Conville said. The lease for six months will cost the organization only \$300. The Morgan building quarters, costing the legion \$50 a month, will be abandoned, and the post will thus stand a rental increase of only \$200 in the six months.

The post voted unanimous protest against extension of executive clemency to Henry Albers, Portland miller, who was sentenced to three years in the penitentiary and fined \$10,000 for violation of the espionage act during the war. Similar action has been taken by the Spanish War Veterans and the G. A. R. The post has been asked to turn out at least a hundred uniformed men for the Memorial day parade.

Commander Conville announced committee chairman appointments as follows: J. W. Morris, grievance; W. A. Eklund, patriotic campaign; Orton E. Goodwin, membership; Archie C. Van Cleave, entertainment; Jay Coffey, headquarters; R. E. Norton, citizenship; Miss Jane Y. Doyle, visiting; Frank Moore, benevolence; A. Descamp, law and order; and Harvey Black, finance. A vaudeville program was given under the direction of A. C. Van Cleave and E. W. Jorgensen of the amusement committee, the numbers being vociferously received by the members.

Tens of thousands of Oregon citizens realize that without Higher Education the whole educational system must topple.
