

FRENCH SALES FIXE TO LOAD CARGO OF GRAIN

Announcement of the charter of the French bark Pierre Antoinette, 2030 tons, is announced for Portland loading. Wheat or barley for the United Kingdom by Straus & Co.

This is the first charter of a sailing vessel for outward grain to be announced during the past six years.

The Pierre Antoinette is a trader in Portland and during the days of the French bounty act made frequent trips to this port.

S. S. ROSE CITY REPORTED SOLD TO ADMIRAL LINE Passenger and freight service between Portland and San Francisco will probably be restored to a pre-war condition in the near future.

Passenger business between California ports and Portland is contemplated and frequent sailings will further stimulate travel by water.

GASOLINE MAY BE SUPPLIED BY SHIPS FROM GULF PORTS Organization of a steamship service between Gulf ports and Portland and Puget Sound which will relieve gasoline shortage in this district and supply the great demand for sulphur, cotton and other products of the South, is being organized by firms at New Orleans and Galveston.

This statement was made this morning by Walter Parker, general manager of the New Orleans Association of Commerce, who, with J. A. Landry, head of the International Storage & Warehouse company, spent the day in the city in connection with the proposed service.

"During the last year we have exported millions of gallons of independent gasoline, which is sent to this territory as well as any other," said Landry. "We have no shortage in the South."

Final plans for the service will be worked out by the New Orleans men visit Seattle.

Gearhart Beach Hotel Plans Are To Be Submitted

Plans for the construction of a tourist hotel at Gearhart beach will be presented to stockholders in a corporation recently organized for the purpose at a meeting in the blue room of the Portland hotel Friday noon.

A committee consisting of J. C. Ainsworth, Julius L. Meier and J. R. Cowles is in charge of the work and will render a report at the meeting. Stock to the value of \$165,000 has been sold and it is proposed to begin building operations when \$200,000 has been secured.

Promoters of the hotel project believe that tourist patronage from June to October would easily fill 500 rooms called for in the architect's plans.
