

Whit Sunday Will Be Celebrated in Major Festivals

NON-LITURGICAL CHURCHES JOIN IN CELEBRATION

Whitsunday, the one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seventh anniversary of the organization of the Holy Catholic church, will be celebrated in Portland Sunday. It will be a remarkable Whitsunday because for the first time in the history of the Christian religion, non-liturgical churches will celebrate it on an elaborate scale.

FESTIVAL HIGH IN RANK

The day has become one of the three baptismal days, the name Whitsunday now being generally attributed to the white garments formerly worn by the candidates for baptism on this feast.

FASTING IS INTRODUCED

The code of Theodosius forbade theatrical performances and the games of the circus during the feast. The custom of halting the days immediately surrounding the festival is comparatively late.

U. S. Has Created Much World Distrust, Dr. Boyd Tells Clubs

America, honored by all nations, commanding the confidence of all nations, at the close of the world war, has inspired world-wide distrust and offense by failing to take advantage of her opportunity for leadership, declared Dr. John H. Boyd, former pastor of the First Presbyterian church, now professor of homiletics at McCormick Theological seminary, Chicago, speaking before the Progressive Business Men's club at the Benson hotel, Thursday afternoon.
