WEATHER CONDITIONS
High pressure extends from the Lake region to the Gulf and South Atlantic coast, and prevails in Oregon, Washington and Idaho. In other sections the pressure is generally low, the prevailing depression being central on the British Columbia coast. Precipitation has occurred on the North Atlantic coast, over a belt reaching from southern California to Minnesota. The temperature in the extreme Northwest. The heaviest rainfall reported was 1.24 inches at Boston, Mass. Moderate rain fell in parts of the Pacific slope, and much warmer in parts of the Plains region. Killing frost is reported from Baker and McCall, Or. The temperature is generally above normal except on the Pacific slope.

WEATHER CONDITIONS

High pressure extends from the Lake region to the Gulf and South Atlantic coast, and prevails over the entire country.
