Decorations day will be observed this year in Pasco, the Woman's club having the program in charge, assisted by the parish and the Linn county Y.W.C.A.

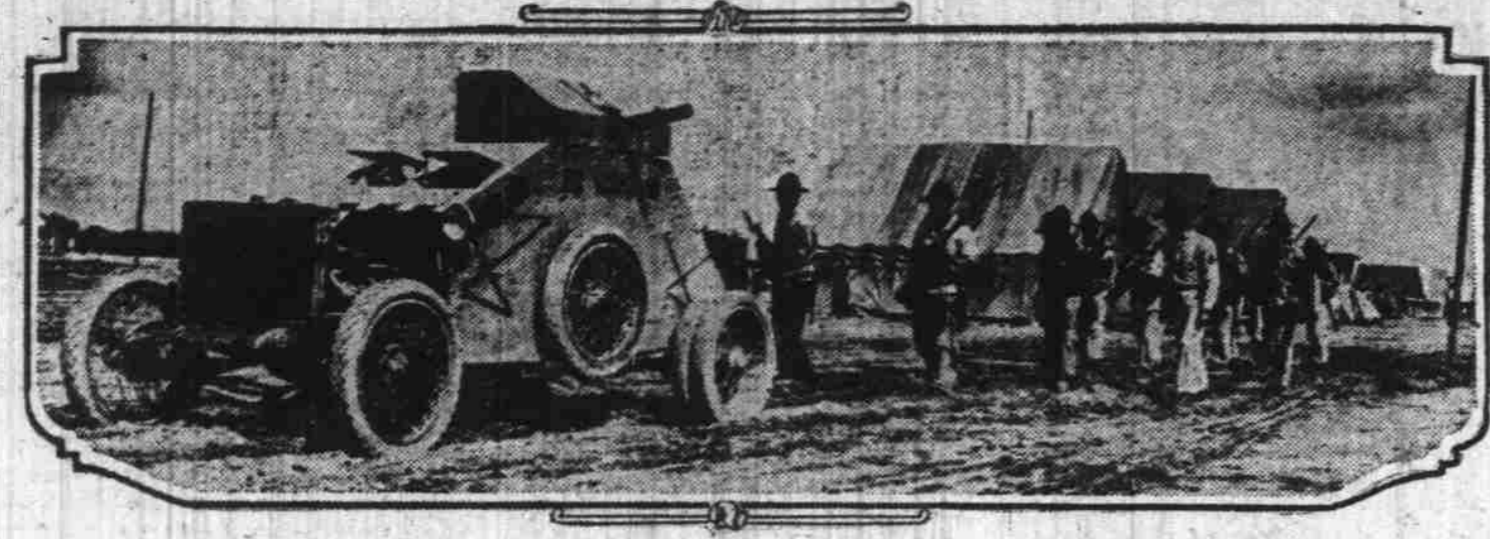

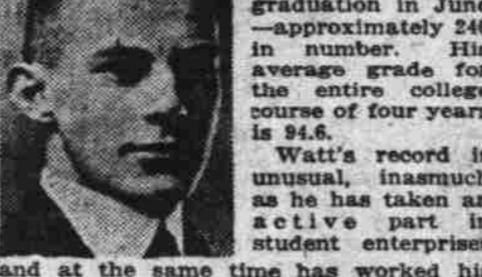
