

GOMPERS WILL GO TO G. O. P. MEET WITH PLATFORM

Washington, May 24.—(I. N. S.)—Samuel Gompers, according to present plans, will head the committee which goes from the American Federation of Labor convention in Montreal to the national Republican convention in Chicago to present organized labor's platform. The committee will leave for Chicago shortly after the federation's convention is called into session June 7.

As International News Service already has announced, the platform to be submitted to both the Republican and Democratic parties by the federation practically has been agreed upon. Its main planks will be:

Government ownership for control of the railroads.
Repeal of the Cummins-Esch transportation law.
Declaration against anti-strike legislation.

Election of federal judges by popular vote for terms of six years.
Enactment of legislation giving the people final voice in determining constitutionality of acts passed by congress or state legislatures.

Declaration against the use of injunction in strikes.
Indorsement of the right of teachers to organize into labor unions.

Declaration against universal military training.
Enactment of legislation placing a graduated tax on all usable land above the acreage cultivated by the owner, and establishment of government experimental farms.

Progressive increase in taxes on incomes and inheritance.
Legislation providing for the federal licensing of all corporations organized for profit and requiring that the books of all corporations shall be open to federal examiners.

Sergeant Offers His Own Life to Save Daughter of Wood

Chicago, May 24.—(I. N. S.)—Sergeant Luther Beard, orderly to Major General Leonard Wood, was in a hospital at Fort Sheridan Saturday suffering from numerous sprains and lacerations as a result of riding a horse directly in front of a fast moving automobile in a successful effort to save Miss Louise Wood, the general's daughter, from death or serious injury.

With Sergeant Beard as her escort, Miss Wood started from the army post for a ride on one of her father's most spirited horses. Two automobiles speed-

ing by caused the animal to rear, and while Miss Wood was trying to master him, a third machine darted on the scene, the driver failing to see the riders until close to them.

Without a moment's hesitation, Sergeant Beard spurred his horse directly in front of the automobile. The impact hurled horse and man five feet, but it also had the effect of swerving the machine so that it missed striking the general's daughter.

Sergeant Beard will recover from his injuries, it was said at the hospital.
