

WEATHER CAUSE OF HIGHER QUOTATION

Strawberries are slowly increasing in the local territory, but there are so few crates arriving from California that the market is higher generally. Sales are being made in the retail markets at 25c a box for the best California stock, while Oregon's are moving at 30c for soft varieties and 35c for Clark seedling.

California cherries are so poor at this time that demand is very small. The crop deteriorated because of the extreme dry weather. Sales at retail around 25c for pock.

A pound for the best.
Asparagus prices are advancing rapidly owing to the cool weather of the last few days. It has been impossible to fill all orders even at the higher figures.

Cabbage prices continue to drop and sales are being made by retailers at 8c to 7c a pound, according to quality. There is so little cauliflower or broccoli available that few stores have any to offer.

While for awhile it looked as if butter would be lower, the market is again firm and prices are unchanged.

Eggs are selling slightly lower again as a result of the bankers withholding money for storage purposes.

Chickens are cheaper, especially the very light weight spring stock.

Veal is also cheaper, with very liberal stocks. Consumers should demand their supplies at the decline.
