

ADVOCATES WOULD HOLD CONGRESS TO PASS BONUS BILL

Session May Be Made to Extend Attention So Senate May Act on Measures Approved by House.

Washington, May 29.—(WASHINGTON BUREAU OF THE JOURNAL)—Triumph of the soldier bonus bill in the house today adds to the complication confronting congressional leaders in plans for recess or an adjournment at the end of the week.

Some Republicans believe one of the strongest cards is in forcing action, so their platform at Chicago can point to the result as an accomplished fact.

Forty Republicans and 52 Democrats were recorded during the bonus measure. Among the Republican opponents were Uncle Joe Cannon, former leader of the bill.

Some Republicans favoring the bill were Leader Mondell, chairman of the ways and means committee.

Debate was acrimonious and bedlam reigned much of the time. Cannon declared people of the Middle West will "reject the issue" offered by this bill.
