Italian Prune Crop Near McMinnville Promises Big Yield

Italian prune crops in the vicinity of McMinnville will be heavy despite the fear that the fruit may have been severely damaged by the winter freeze. This is proved by a sample of the yield taken from the 20-acre tract of W. T. Lambert by G. S. Miller of 1554 Burrage street, Portland. The Portland fruit, well stocked with healthy appearing fruit, is the early stages of development which was plucked from the Lambert farm, indicates that the June crop in this vicinity will be small. Last year Lambert harvested 19 tons of prunes. This year he expects to gather 25 tons. Similar conditions are found on the Galloway ranch. Apple trees, early cherries, walnut and peach trees, however, have been seriously affected by the freeze.
