

# Beavers Drop Fifth Straight.: Aberdeen Golfers Lose.: High School Team to Make Tour

## Joe Jenkins Beats Locals With Homer

SCORING three runners ahead of him with a powerful home run swat into the left field bleachers, Joe Jenkins gave the Salt Lake club a 3 to 2 victory over the Beavers today, Sunday, in a hard fought 16-inning contest. Joe Jenkins hit the only one he made during the day, gave the Bees five victories out of the six games played, and evened up the doubling given Salt Lake by the Beavers during the opening week of the season.

### TOUGH LUCK AGAIN

The breaks—those that put games in the win column—broke against the Beavers and as a result another tough luck feat goes into the records opposite Suda Sutherland's name, Ralph Stroud getting credit for the victory.

Portland got away in front by scoring one in the first and two in the second. Salt Lake tied in up in the third and fourth and took the lead in the seventh. The Beavers came back strong in the eighth and tied the count, and only "Tex" Wistler's single prevented the Beavers from putting the game on the ice.

### DOUBLES TO CENTER

In the tenth frame, with Krug out of the way, Rummel doubled to center. Shelly drew a walk and pulled off a double steal with Rummel. Mulligan walked, filling the bases. Sand hit to Blue, and Rummel was nailed, but Sand was safe at first on a close decision. Then up stepped Jenkins. What happened has been recounted.

Portland had men on the bases in every inning but could not get hit when they counted.

Wistler's double and Maise's single rang the bell in the first inning. Three singles in a row with Siglin on second after the Bees had pulled off a snappy double play on an attempted sacrifice, resulted in two runs. Mulligan's boot on Rummel's throw-in aided somewhat.

Maggert's walk and singles by Johnson, Rummel to Shelly pulled across two, the third for the Bees. Mulligan's single and Sand's drive to right, followed by a sacrifice and a fielder's choice, tied the count in the fourth.

### VISITORS TAKE LEAD

Maggert's single, Johnson's double and Krug's single put the visitors two runs ahead in the seventh.

In the eighth, Siglin drew a walk, but was forced by Johnson. Sutherland got a scratchy hit to Krug. Blue's triple to center scored both runs and with Wistler's pop into a double.

Kingdon reached third in the fourth when one down but could not score. Two runners were on in the sixth, but the necessary hit was missing. The Bees' runners were out throughout the game.

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A CALL has been issued for all the all-star baseball players of the Portland Intercollegiate league to report for practice on the Vaughn street grounds Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, for it begins to look as though the proposed barnstorming trip through the West and as far east as Ohio is going to be taken by the all-star team.

Jack Routledge, president of the Portland Baseball association, and Bill Ellsworth, coach of the Franklin high aggregation, are responsible for the team, and they have received word from Kansas City, Chicago, Milwaukee and Toledo to the effect that games can be had with star teams of those cities. The proposition has the support of the Portland Chamber of Commerce as well as the Oregon state body, and the primary thing at present is finances. It will take the team to the neighborhood of \$5000 to transport the party of 14 on the four weeks' tour, and the boys are confident that the publicity given Oregon and Oregon products will be well worth the expenditure.

"We can get plenty of games," said Routledge, "and with the team that we propose to take we are being made to win a large majority of our games from the best high school, independent semi-pro squads in the country. We want to leave next Sunday night; but, of course, the start can be put off a few days. If we cannot secure enough funds to take us as far east as Ohio, we are assured of making a journey lasting two weeks at least."
