

PAPER MILLS PAY TWO MILLIONS FOR CLATSOP TIMBER

Approximately \$2,000,000 is involved in the deal through which the Crown-Willamette Paper company, operating mills at Camas, Wash., and Oregon City, Or., Wednesday acquired the entire holdings of the Hammond Lumber company, in Clatsop county, as a pulp wood supply source.

The property includes 17,500 acres, which contain about 650,000,000 feet of standing timber, which cruises close to 85 per cent spruce and hemlock, according to R. L. Herren, timber superintendent of the paper company. Herren represented the Crown-Willamette company in the transfer and G. B. McLeod, manager of the lumber company, handled the sale end.

It is said that the new property gives the paper company a probable five year supply of spruce and hemlock, considering the demands of both the Camas and Oregon City mills. The entire acreage is in Clatsop county in what is known as the Necanicum district. The company already had large holdings, where it is cutting, in the Young's river district, and with the new tract is said to be assured a 20 year supply of timber.

With the timber acquired also comes 15 miles of logging railroad, 4 engines,

30 logging cars and 18 donkey engines, as well as a machine shop.

Papers covering the purchase were signed Wednesday in San Francisco, where the head offices of the paper company are located, and consummation of the deal was announced to the Portland office by long distance telephone.

Woman Hurlled From Moving Auto, Injured; Driver Is Arrested

Rina Furukawa, wealthy Japanese rooming house proprietor, said to have made poison whiskey in a tin can, was found guilty Wednesday afternoon in Federal Judge Bean's court on three charges of violating the prohibition law, and as a result faces a \$500 fine and six months' jail sentence. The jury returned the verdict of guilt after a few minutes' deliberation.

Man Steps Out of Window in Sleep; He May Not Live

Boise, Idaho, June 10.—T. E. Larson of Salt Lake City, well known commercial traveling man, fell from the second story of the Owyhee hotel, Tuesday morning at 2 o'clock, while asleep. He is in a local hospital with a fractured skull and small hope for his recovery is entertained.

Larson, who is said to be subject to walking in his sleep, was seen to tumble from his room in the hotel by a policeman, who rushed to the spot and found Larson unconscious, blood streaming from his nose and ears. He was rushed to the hospital, where an operation was immediately performed.

The visitor went to bed at 12 o'clock Monday night and jostled with the night clerk at the hotel over a large dinner he had just consumed. Larson is married and the father of two children. His family is visiting in California.

OREGONIAN OFFERS DEFENSE IN SUIT

A suit for \$50,000 for alleged libel, which Merrill F. Hanville, who was principal of the Adair school in Astoria, filed against the Oregonian Publishing company, went to trial Wednesday before a jury in the court of Circuit Judge H. H. Belt, sitting in Portland. It is expected the evidence will be completed today.

The suit is brought because of the publication of articles in regard to the unwelcome attentions of Hanville to Miss Lela Ashworth of Astoria and their outcome. The evidence of Wednesday showed that Hanville had solicited the publication of the first article on this subject, and that statements made in this article called forth a reply, giving alleged facts about him. It is on the second article that Hanville bases his suit for damages.

While on the witness stand Hanville admitted that at the time he was trying to cultivate the attention of Miss Ashworth he was married, but his wife was suing for divorce. Miss Ashworth and her father both testified that Hanville's attentions through letters and sending of flowers were unwelcome and annoying. Some of the letters were introduced in evidence.
