

ROSE SHOW PRIZE LIST AND RULES ARE MADE PUBLIC

Society Issues Folder for Distribution Among Prospective Contestants in Exhibition June 21.

Prize lists, rules and regulations of the Portland Rose Show have just been issued by the Portland Rose Society in the form of a folder which will be generally distributed among prospective exhibitors.

The Rose Show this year, together with the children's rose show, will be held on the Park block between Columbia and Clay streets, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, June 21, 22 and 23. The Rose society schedule follows:

Section A Single Rose Display Exhibited in Vases—Class 1, best bloom from the garden. Not more than one rose shall be exhibited from any one exhibitor.

Section B Specimen Blooms Exhibited in Regulation Boxes—Class 1, six best separate named varieties.

Section C Climbing and Rambling Roses Exhibited in Vases or Baskets—Class 1, best display of not less than 6 and not more than 12 sprays of any one named variety.

Section D Large Displays of Roses Exhibited in Vases or Baskets—Class 1, vase, bowl or basket of best roses containing more than 25 blooms.

Section E For Amateurs Who Have Never Won a Prize Exhibited in Vases—Class 1, best three roses, either one variety or mixed.

Section F Single, Decorative and Miniature Roses Exhibited in Vases or Baskets—Class 1, best display of decorative, prize or single flowered roses of any one named variety.

Section G For Owners and Professional Gardeners in Charge of Private Gardens. Trophies awarded to owner and bonus medal by the American Rose Society to the gardener.
