Failure of Treaty Lamented If League Fails, Victory Lost

"Even though I was on the fighting front, even though my soul was torn by the ghastliest of tragedies and uplifted by the greatest scenes of heroism, never in my whole life have I had the thrill that I felt when I saw peace signed at Versailles." So declared Mrs. Idah McGilbons Gibson of Washington, who has been internationally characterized as "the best known and best beloved of all newspaper women," who was a visitor in Portland last week. Mrs. Gibson was in uniform for 27 months, during the period of the publicity department of the war council of the American Red Cross. She was overseas four times, she was on all of the firing fronts except the Russian front; she was under fire for five hours clad in men's clothing, a Sammy overcoat, hat and gas mask and then as a climax to this thrilling and dramatic experience, she witnessed the signing of the peace treaty. "There was silence in this room, everyone seemed filled with a kind of awe, because the greatest history the world has ever known was made that day and as we sat there the door at the back of the room opened and was a tall, spare man dressed in the awkward clothing that America prescribes for her men on state occasions, entered. There was an audible intake of breath as the Americans recognized the president of the United States. As we sat down at the table a little round-faced man in close beside me, it was Lloyd George of England, and then came Clemenceau, the Tiger; he seemed to have grown visibly taller; and after him was Orlando of Italy, and then the different countries, whose men had been concerned in this great treaty. Last and alone came two men with heads bowed; it didn't take any imagination to see them walking to their execution; these were the emissaries that Germany had sent to sign the peace treaty. "After a few moments of silence there was a little speech between Clemenceau and President Wilson and then solemnly the representative of America in the person of her president, walked around the table and was the first to sign. After him came Lloyd George, then Clemenceau and the others and then last the two Germans signed, and as the last man put his name to the book we heard the whir of airplanes, the dancing sound of French horns and the playing of laughing waters of the fountains of Versailles; fountains which were playing for the first time since war was declared, and we walked out into the sunshine and shook each other's hands and said 'the peace of the world is here.' "Of all the people who signed that treaty that day America is the only nation that hasn't ratified it. When I repeat that sentence it makes me ashamed. My mind turns to the quiet Onks park, Flag day. Failure of Treaty Lamented If League Fails, Victory Lost. "I am a widow with one child, a son. At 17, six days before war was declared, he enlisted in the Eighteenth field artillery. He was all through the 'big show,' Chateau Thierry, the Argonne and San Mihiel. He was badly gassed but I have him back and if the peace treaty and the League of Nations is not signed by America, if we do not finish what we have begun, I shall feel that the 27 months that I gave to my country and the three years out of my boy's life, were absolutely given in vain. Mrs. Gibson is a constant reader of 'Confessions of a Wife,' which ran serially through the newspapers for seven years—the longest serial ever written. She received literally millions of letters from readers of the 'Confessions.' I was stopped on the streets of Paris by American doughboys and asked if I was the author of the story, and even in a camp over in Italy, when one of the boys learned I was an American newspaper woman and my name was Gibson, he asked me if I wrote the 'Confessions,' what I had to say, I shall feel that the 27 months that I gave to my country and the three years out of my boy's life, were absolutely given in vain. "The evolution of the sphere of woman is so constantly changing and broadening that it constitutes a very interesting study. The enfranchisement of the women of our nation is going to be a great thing for politics and a great thing for women. Until woman, in earnest, becomes office seekers in earnest and have something to gain personally by 'playing' politics, I think they will be unskillful in the use of their judgment and will vote for men and measure rather than parties. I don't believe they will get into the game to much purpose for less than 10 years. If they could maintain this fine sense of justice in their judgment I would like to see women holding office. "Like men they will not be seeking election to high positions until they have passed the 40 mark; then their duty as producers of the race have been completed yet they have the best years of their lives before them and I am sure they might much better be employed in affairs of state than in playing bridge and getting up oyster suppers. They will be much happier and they will be much more comfortable for their husbands, children and friends. For public life surely does divert one of pettiness and smallness of vision."
